A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TOURISM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to amend section 201B-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to reduce the number of ex 2 officio nonvoting members of the board of directors of the 3 Hawaii tourism authority from four to three and to provide that the director of business, economic development, and tourism, or 5 6 a designated representative, shall be an ex officio voting member. SECTION 2. Section 201B-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 8 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows: 10 The authority shall be headed by a policy-making board of directors which consists of twelve public, voting 11 members, one ex officio voting member, and [four] three ex 12 officio nonvoting members; provided that: 13 Twelve public, voting members shall be appointed by 14 (1)15 the governor as provided in section 26-34, except as otherwise provided by law; 16

- 1 (2) The twelve public, voting members shall be composed of
 2 at least one representative each from the city and
 3 county of Honolulu and the counties of Hawaii, Kauai,
 4 and Maui; the remaining public members shall be
 5 appointed at-large;
- 6 (3) Of the twelve public, voting members, three shall be appointed by the governor from a list of three names 7 submitted for each appointment by the president of the 8 senate, and three shall be appointed by the governor 9 10 from a list of three names submitted for each 11 appointment by the speaker of the house of 12 representatives; provided that if fewer than three 13 names are submitted for each appointment, the governor 14 may disregard the list;
 - (4) At least six of the twelve public, voting members shall have knowledge, experience, and expertise in the area of visitor industry management, marketing, promotion, transportation, retail, entertainment, or visitor attractions, and at least one shall have knowledge, experience, and expertise in the area of Hawaiian cultural practices; provided that no more than three members shall represent, be employed by, or

JUSTIFICATION SHEET

DEPARTMENT:

Department of Business, Economic Development and Tourism

TITLE:

A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO TOURISM.

PURPOSE:

The purpose of this bill is to amend section 201B-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to make the Director of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism, or a designated representative, an ex officio voting member of the Hawaii Tourism Authority board, thereby amending the voting powers of the board to consist of twelve public, voting members, one ex officio voting member, and three ex officio nonvoting members.

MEANS:

Amend section 201B-2(b), Hawaii Revised Statutes.

JUSTIFICATION:

The Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism was instrumental in establishing the Hawaii Tourism Authority and was an advocate in support of its formation.

When the Authority was established, no committee reports from the legislature identified any apprehension or objections to the participation of the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism on the board as an ex officio voting member. Additionally, there was no public testimony submitted that questioned the role of the Department on the board of directors.

As a state policy board, with responsibilities broader than tourism marketing, the director of the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism, or a designated representative, should be an ex officio voting member on the board.

Impact on the public:
There is no impact on the public.

Impact on the department and other agencies: This legislation would restore the vote to the director of the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism, or a designated representative, on the Hawaii Tourism Authority board of directors.
