A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE PENAL CODE.

17

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Throughout history victims of emergencies or
2	disasters have often become victimized a second time by
3	opportunists who engage in civil unrest, looting, and other
4	crime. Most recently, the world had a front row seat to
5	wide-spread criminal activity and looting following Hurricane
6	Katrina.
7	The legislature recognizes that if strong measures to
8	control law and order are not in place before a disaster or
9	emergency, civil unrest and looting and other crimes are likely
10	to increase after a disaster or emergency. The legislature also
11	recognizes that preventive measures require fewer resources than
12	that required to restore and rebuild.
13	The legislature also finds that when resources are needed
14	to restore law and order, emergency response aid to victims is
15	hampered and delayed, leaving victims at an increased risk of
16	bodily injury or death.

1 unrest and looting and other crimes before they occur and that 2 severe penalties will deter the majority of these opportunistic 3 crimes. 4 The purpose of this Act is to significantly increase the criminal penalties for the commission of certain crimes during a 5 time of civil defense emergency proclaimed by the governor under 6 7 chapter 128, Hawaii Revised Statutes. 8 SECTION 2. Chapter 707, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 9 10 and to read as follows: 11 "\$707- Assault against a civil defense emergency worker. 12 (1) A person commits the offense of assault against a civil defense emergency worker if the person, during the time of a 13 14 civil defense emergency proclaimed by the governor pursuant to chapter 128, within the area covered by the civil defense 15 16 emergency: (a) Intentionally, knowingly, or recklessly causes serious 17 18 or substantial bodily injury to a civil defense 19 emergency worker; or 20 (b) Intentionally, knowingly, or recklessly causes bodily 21 injury to a civil defense emergency worker with a

dangerous instrument.

1	(2) Assault against a civil defense emergency worker is a
2	class B felony."
3	SECTION 3. Chapter 708, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4	amended by adding two new sections to be appropriately
5	designated and to read as follows:
6	"§708- Burglary of a dwelling during a civil defense
7	emergency. (1) A person commits the offense of burglary of a
8	dwelling during a civil defense emergency if the person:
9	(a) Intentionally enters or remains unlawfully in a
10	dwelling with intent to commit therein a crime against
11	a person or against property rights; and
12	(b) Recklessly disregards a risk that the building is the
13	dwelling of another, and the building is such a
14	dwelling,
15	during the time of a civil defense emergency proclaimed by the
16	governor pursuant to chapter 128, within the area covered by the
17	civil defense emergency.
18	(2) Burglary of a dwelling during a civil defense
19	emergency is a class A felony.
20	§708- Burglary of a building during a civil defense
21	emergency. (1) A person commits the offense of burglary of a
22	building during a civil defense emergency if the person

12	(1)	Law enforcement officer, including but not limited to
13		any police officer, public safety officer, parole or
14		probation officer, or any other officer of any county,
15		state, federal, or military agency authorized to
16		exercise law enforcement or police powers;
17	(2)	Firefighter, emergency medical services personnel,
18		emergency medical technician, ambulance crewmember, or
19		any other emergency response personnel;
20	<u>(3)</u>	Member of the Hawaii national guard on any duty or
21		service done under or in pursuance of an order or call

1		of the governor or the President of the United States
2		or any proper authority;
3	(4)	Member of the United States Army, Air Force, Navy,
4		Marines, or Coast Guard on any duty or service done
5		under or in pursuance of an order or call of the
6		President of the United States or any proper
7		authority;
8	(5)	Member of the national guard from any other state
9		ordered into service by any proper authority; or
10	(6)	Person engaged in civil defense functions as
11		authorized by the director or vice director of civil
12		defense who are engaged in civil defense functions
13		under chapter 128."
14	SECT	ION 5. Section 708-820, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
15	amended by	y amending subsection (1) to read as follows:
16	"(1)	A person commits the offense of criminal property
17	damage in	the first degree if:
18	(a)	The person intentionally or knowingly damages property
19		and thereby recklessly places another person in danger
20		of death or bodily injury; [or]

1	(b)	The person intentionally or knowingly damages the
2		property of another, without the other's consent, in
3		an amount exceeding \$20,000[+]; or
4	<u>(c)</u>	The person intentionally or knowingly damages the
5		property of another during the time of a civil defense
6		emergency proclaimed by the governor pursuant to
7		chapter 128, within the area covered by the civil
8		defense emergency."
9	SECT	ION 6. Section 708-830.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
10	amended by	y amending subsection (1) to read as follows:
11	"(1)	A person commits the offense of theft in the first
12	degree if	the person commits theft:
13	(a)	Of property or services, the value of which exceeds
14		\$20,000;
15	(b)	Of a firearm; [or]
16	(c)	Of dynamite or other explosive[+]; or
17	<u>(d)</u>	Of property or services during the time of a civil
18		defense emergency proclaimed by the governor pursuant
19		to chapter 128, within the area covered by the civil
20		defense emergency, the value of which exceeds \$300."
21	SECT	ION 7. Section 708-840, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
22	amended by	y amending subsection (1) to read as follows:

1	"(1) A person commits the offense of robbery in the first
2	degree if, in the course of committing theft:
3	(a) The person attempts to kill another, or intentionally
4	or knowingly inflicts or attempts to inflict serious
5	bodily injury upon another; [or]
6	(b) The person is armed with a dangerous instrument and:
7	(i) The person uses force against the person of
8	anyone present with intent to overcome that
9	person's physical resistance or physical power of
10	resistance; or
11	(ii) The person threatens the imminent use of force
12	against the person of anyone who is present with
13	intent to compel acquiescence to the taking of or
14	escaping with the property[\div];
15	(c) The person uses force against the person of anyone
16	present with the intent to overcome that person's
17	physical resistance or physical power of resistance
18	during the time of a civil defense emergency
19	proclaimed by the governor pursuant to chapter 128,
20	within the area covered by the civil defense
21	emergency; or

1	<u>(d)</u>	The person threatens the imminent use of force against
2		the person of anyone who is present with intent to
3		compel acquiescence to the taking of or escaping with
4		the property during the time of a civil defense
5		emergency proclaimed by the governor pursuant to
6		chapter 128, within the area covered by the civil
7		defense emergency."
8	SECT	ION 8. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
9	were matu	red, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that
10	were begu	n, before its effective date.
11	SECT	ION 9. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
12	and stric	ken. New statutory material is underscored.
13	SECT	ION 10. This Act shall take effect on upon its
14	approval.
