TITLE:

A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO CONTROLLED

SUBSTANCES.

PURPOSE:

The purpose of this bill is to amend section 329-64, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to conform with changes to the Uniform Controlled

Substances Act enacted by Act 193, Session

Laws of Hawaii 2005.

MEANS:

Amend section 329-64(a), Hawaii Revised

Statutes.

JUSTIFICATION:

Act 193, Session Laws of Hawaii, added three new sections to chapter 329, Hawaii Revised Statutes, relating to the sale and transport of pseudoephedrine products. The proposed amendments to section 329-64(a) clarify that the "sale, transfer, furnishing, or receipt" of pseudoephedrine and norpseudoephedrine are regulated by these new sections.

Impact on the public: Clarifies the intent of Act 193/Session Laws of Hawaii, 2005 relating to the sale of pseudoephedrine.

Impact on the department and other agencies:
These proposed amendments would assist NED in clarifying regulations of the Uniform
Controlled Substances Act.
