A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HIGHWAY SAFETY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 291C-161, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
2	amended to read as follows:		
3	"§291C-161 Penalties. (a) It is a violation for any		
4	person to violate any of the provisions of this chapter except		
5	as otherwise specified in [subsection] subsections (c) and (d)		
6	[of this section] and unless the violation is by other law of		
7	this State declared to be a felony, misdemeanor, or petty		
8	misdemeanor.		
9	(b) Except as provided in [subsection] subsections (c) and		
10	(d) every person who [violates] fails to comply with any		
11	provision of this chapter for which another penalty is not		
12	provided shall be fined:		
13	(1) Not more than \$200 for a first [conviction] failure to		
14	<pre>comply thereof;</pre>		
15	(2) Not more than \$300 for [conviction of] a second		
16	[offense committed] failure to comply within one year		
17	after the date of the first [offense] failure to		
18	<pre>comply; and</pre>		

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1	(3)	Not more than \$500 for [conviction of] a third or
2		subsequent [offense committed] failure to comply
3		within one year after the date of the first [offense]
4		<pre>failure to comply;</pre>
5	provided	that upon a conviction for a violation of
6	section 2	91C-12, 291C-12.5, 291C-12.6, or 291C-95, the person
7	shall be	sentenced in accordance with that section.
8	(c)	Every person who violates section 291C-13 or 291C-18
9	shall:	
10	(1)	Be fined not more than \$200 or imprisoned not more
11		than ten days for a first conviction thereof;
12	(2)	Be fined not more than \$300 [ex]_ imprisoned not more
13		than twenty days, or both, for conviction of a second
14		offense committed within one year after the date of
15		the first offense; and
16	(3)	Be fined not more than \$500 [er], imprisoned not more
17		than six months, or both, for conviction of a third or
18		subsequent offense committed within one year after the
19		date of the first offense.
20	<u>(d)</u>	Every person who fails to comply with section
21	291C-72(a) or (d), shall be liable as follows:

1	(1)	For a first failure to comply, a fine of not less than
2		\$150 and revocation of license and privilege to
3		operate a vehicle for a period not less than ninety
4		days;
5	(2)	For a second failure to comply within one year of the
6		date of a first failure to comply, a fine of not less
7		than \$300 and revocation of license and privilege to
8		operate a vehicle for a period not less than
9		one-hundred and eighty days; and
10	(3)	For a third or subsequent failure to comply within one
11		year of the date of the second failure to comply, a
12		fine of not less than \$1000, revocation of license and
13		privilege to operate a vehicle for a period of one
14		year, and thirty days imprisonment.
15	[(d)]	(e) The court may assess a sum not to exceed \$50 for
16	the cost of	of issuing a penal summons upon any person who fails to
17	appear at	the place within the time specified in the citation
18	issued to	the person for any traffic violation.
19	['(e)]	(f) The court may require a person who violates any
20	of the pro	ovisions of this chapter to attend a course of
21	instructio	on in driver retraining as deemed appropriate by the
22	court, in	addition to any other penalties imposed.

1	(g) The requirement to provide proof of financial
2	responsibility pursuant to section 287-20 shall not apply to
3	revocation under subsection (d), however, the court may set an
4	appropriate amount to be paid by the defendant as proof of
5	financial responsibility for the reinstatement of the
6	defendant's license and privilege to operate a vehicle."
7	SECTION 2. Section 287-20, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
8	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
9	"(a) Whenever a driver's license has been suspended or
10	revoked:
11	(1) Pursuant to section 291E-65 or part III of chapter
12	291E, except as provided in section 291E-41(f);
13	(2) Upon a conviction of any offense pursuant to law; or
14	(3) In the case of minors, pursuant to part V of chapter
15	571,
16	the license shall not at any time thereafter be issued to the
17	person whose license has been suspended or revoked, nor shall
18	the person thereafter operate a motor vehicle, unless and until
19	the person has furnished and thereafter maintains proof of
20	financial responsibility; provided that this section shall not
21	apply to a license suspended pursuant to section 291C-161(d),
22	291E-61(b)(1), or 291E-64(b)(1), any conviction of a moving

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- 1 violation, any administrative license suspension pursuant to
- 2 chapter 291A, or the first conviction within a five-year period
- 3 for driving without a valid motor vehicle insurance policy."
- 4 SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 5 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 6 begun, before its effective date.
- 7 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 8 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 9 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2007.
