A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HIGHWAY SAFETY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 291C-161, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended to read as follows:
3	"§291C-161 Penalties. (a) It is a violation for any
4	person to violate any of the provisions of this chapter except
5	as otherwise specified in [subsection] subsections (c) and (d)
6	of this section and unless the violation is by other law of this
7	State declared to be a felony, misdemeanor, or petty
8	misdemeanor.
9	(b) Except as provided in [subsection] subsections (c) and
10	(d) every person who violates any provision of this chapter for
11	which another penalty is not provided shall be fined:
12	(1) Not more than \$200 for a first conviction thereof;
13	(2) Not more than \$300 for conviction of a second offense
14	committed within one year after the date of the first
15	offense; and
16	(3) Not more than \$500 for conviction of a third or
17	subsequent offense committed within one year after the
18	date of the first offense;

1	provided	that upon a conviction for a violation of
2	section 2	91C-12, 291C-12.5, 291C-12.6, or 291C-95, the person
3	shall be	sentenced in accordance with that section.
4	(c)	Every person who violates section 291C-13 or 291C-18
5	shall:	
6	(1)	Be fined not more than \$200 or imprisoned not more
7		than ten days for a first conviction thereof;
8	(2)	Be fined not more than \$300 or imprisoned not more
9		than twenty days or both for conviction of a second
10		offense committed within one year after the date of
11		the first offense; and
12	(3)	Be fined not more than \$500 or imprisoned not more
13		than six months or both for conviction of a third or
14		subsequent offense committed within one year after the
15		date of the first offense.
16	(d)	Every person who violates section 291C-72(a) or (d),
17	shall be	sentenced as follows without the possibility of
18	probation	or suspension of sentence:
19	(1)	For a first conviction thereof, to a fine of not less
20		than \$150 and revocation of license and privilege to
21		operate a vehicle for a period not less than ninety
22		days;

1	(2)	For a conviction of a second offense, to a fine of not		
2		less than \$300 and revocation of license and privilege		
3		to operate a vehicle for a period not less than one-		
4		hundred and eighty days; and		
5	(3)	For a conviction of a third or subsequent offense		
6		committed within one year of the date of the second		
7		offense, to a fine of not less than \$1000, revocation		
8		of license and privilege to operate a vehicle for a		
9		period of one year, and thirty days imprisonment.		
10	[-(d) -] <u>(e)</u> The court may assess a sum not to exceed \$50 for		
11	the cost of issuing a penal summons upon any person who fails to			
12	appear at the place within the time specified in the citation			
13	issued to the person for any traffic violation.			
14	$[\frac{(e)}{(f)}]$ The court may require a person who violates any			
15	of the provisions of this chapter to attend a course of			
16	instruction in driver retraining as deemed appropriate by the			
17	court, in addition to any other penalties imposed.			
18	SECT	ION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that		
19	matured,	penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were		
20	begun, before its effective date.
