- 14 [revolving] special fund for the purpose of providing advance
- 15 funding to meet reimbursable costs incurred in connection with
- 16 federally financed research and training projects. Any
- 17 reimbursement received as a result of providing advance funding
- 18 shall be deposited into the research and training [revolving]
- 19 special fund to be used for the purpose of meeting reimbursable
- 20 costs incurred in connection with federally financed projects.

Section 304-8.97, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 20 repealed. 21 22 ["\frac{8304-8.97}{University of Hawaii alumni revolving fund. 23 There is established a revolving fund to be known as the

1 University of Hawaii alumni revolving fund, into which shall be 2 deposited funds and proceeds received by the university from alumni activities and donations from alumni. Funds deposited 3 4 into this account may be expended by the university for all costs associated with conducting alumni affairs activities and programs 5 6 for the university system, including but not limited to expenses for honoraria, hotel and room rentals, food and refreshment, 7 printing and mailing, banners and signs, plaques and awards, 8 airfare and per diem, leis, rental of audio visual, musical and 9 10 stage equipment, and activity supplies and materials, without 11 regard to statutory competitive bidding requirements."] SECTION 21. Section 304-8.98, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 12 repealed. 13 14 ["[\$304-8.98] University of Hawaii graduate application 15 revolving fund. There is established a University of Hawaii graduate application revolving fund for graduate program 16 application processing. The board of regents may establish 17 appropriate charges for application processing. The revenues 18 from such charges shall be deposited into this revolving fund and 19 be used to pay the costs of processing applications to all 20 graduate programs."] 21 22 SECTION 22. Section 304-68.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is repealed. 23

TITLE:

A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE FUNDS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII.

PURPOSE:

The purpose of this bill is to consolidate various special and revolving funds of the University of Hawaii for efficient management and greater flexibility into four special funds:

University of Hawaii at Manoa Special Fund, University of Hawaii at Hilo Special Fund, University of Hawaii-West Oahu Special Fund, and University of Hawaii Systemwide

Support Special Fund.

MEANS:

Add four new sections to chapter 304, amend sections 304-1.5, 304-8.1, 304-8.41(c), 304-8.7, 304-8.96, and 305-4, and repeal sections 304-8.3, 304-8.4, 304-8.5, 304-8.91, 304-8.93, 304-8.94, 304-8.945, 304-8.946, 304-8.955, 304-8.97, 304-8.98, 304-68.5, 304-77, 304-112, 305-5, and 308-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

JUSTIFICATION:

The University of Hawaii System has over forty special and revolving funds. This bill repeals a number of special funds and creates four special funds. Some of these funds being repealed are outdated and are no longer being used, while others will be combined for programmatic purposes. Accounts will be established in the appropriate new special funds for the program's continued use. Funds to be repealed include:

- Transcript and Diploma Revolving Fund
- Vocational and Technical Training Projects Revolving Fund
- Animal Research Farm, Waialee, Oahu Revolving Fund
- Child Care Programs Revolving Fund
- Library Special Fund



- Conference Center Revolving Fund
- Conference Center Revolving Fund for Hilo Campus
- University of Hawaii-Hilo Theatre Revolving Fund
- University of Hawaii Community Services Special Fund
- University of Hawaii Alumni Revolving Fund
- University of Hawaii Graduate Application Revolving Fund
- International Exchange Health Care Tourism Revolving Fund
- Seed Distribution Revolving Fund
- Western Governors University Special Fund
- Community College Conference Center Revolving Fund
- University Parking Revolving Fund

The University is also reclassifying four revolving funds as special funds to better reflect their usage. They include:

- Research and Training Special Fund
- University of Hawaii at Manoa
 Intercollegiate Athletic Special Fund and
 University of Hawaii at Hilo
 Intercollegiate Athletic Special Fund
- University of Hawaii Housing Assistance Special Fund

Creating campus special funds provides greater flexibility in establishing new programs without having to create new special funds. As the University of Hawaii becomes increasingly fee conscious, hosts new activities, and establishes nontraditional training and consultative services it will need flexibility in the use of its special funds. The University is charged with generating more of its operating revenue and this bill will simplify funding of programs with multiple funding sources. Consolidation of special funds is consistent with the streamlining and efficient management of these funds.



The creation of campus funds will be in alignment with the program ID format for budgetary purposes.
