A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LEGISLATIVE VACANCIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 17-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "§17-1 United States senator. When a vacancy occurs in
- 4 the office of United States senator, the vacancy shall be filled
- 5 for the unexpired term at the following state general
- $\mathbf{6}$ election[τ]; provided that the vacancy occurs not later than
- 7 4:30 p.m. on the sixtieth day prior to the primary for
- 8 nominating candidates to be voted for at the election; otherwise
- 9 at the state general election next following. The chief
- 10 election officer shall issue a proclamation designating the
- 11 election for filling the vacancy. Pending the election the
- 12 governor shall make a temporary appointment to fill the vacancy
- 13 [and the] by selecting a person from a list of five prospective
- 14 appointees submitted by the same political party as the vacator.
- 15 The person so appointed shall serve until the election and
- 16 qualification of the person duly elected to fill the vacancy and
- 17 shall be, at the time of appointment and for at least
- 18 months immediately prior to the appointment, a registered member



1	of the same political party as the [senator causing the
2	vacancy.] vacator. If the vacator is not a member of any
3	political party, the governor shall appoint a person who is not
4	and has not been, for at least months immediately prior
5	to the appointment, a member of any political party. All
6	candidates for the unexpired term shall be nominated and elected
7	in accordance with this title."
8	SECTION 2. Section 17-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
9	amended to read as follows:
10	"§17-3 State senator. (a) Whenever any vacancy in the
11	membership of the state senate occurs, the term of which ends at
12	the next succeeding general election[, the]:
13	(1) The governor shall make an appointment within sixty
14	calendar days following the first day of vacancy to
15	fill the vacancy for the unexpired term [and the
16	appointee shall be of] by selecting a person from a
17	list of five prospective appointees submitted by the
18	same political party [or nonpartisanship] as the
19	[person the appointee succeeds.] vacator. The
20	prospective appointees shall be, at the time of
21	appointment and for at least months immediately
22	prior to the appointment, registered members of the

1		political party. The political party shall submit the
2		list of prospective appointees to the governor within
3		calendar days following the first day of vacancy; and
4	(2)	If the vacator is not a member of any political party,
5		the governor shall within sixty calendar days
6		following the first day of vacancy appoint a person
7		who is not and has not been, for at least months
8		immediately prior to the appointment, a member of any
9		political party.
10	(b)	In the case of a vacancy, the term of which does not
11	end at th	e next succeeding general election:
12	(1)	If it occurs not later than on the tenth day prior to
13		the close of filing for the next succeeding primary
14		election, the vacancy shall be filled for the
15		unexpired term at the next succeeding general
16		election. The chief election officer shall issue a
17		proclamation designating the election for filling the
18		vacancy. All candidates for the unexpired term shall
19		be nominated and elected in accordance with this
20		title. Pending the election the governor shall make a
21		temporary appointment to fill the vacancy and the
22		person so appointed shall serve until the election of

1		the person duly elected to fill the vacancy. The
2		[appointee shall be of] governor shall make the
3		appointment from a list of five prospective appointees
4		submitted by the same political party [or
5		nonpartisanship] as the [person the appointee
6		succeeds.] vacator. The prospective appointees shall
7		be, at the time of appointment and for at least
8		months immediately prior to the appointment,
9		registered members of the political party. If the
10		vacator is not a member of any political party, the
11		governor shall appoint a person who is not and has not
12		been, for at least months immediately prior to
13		the appointment, a member of any political party;
14	(2)	If it occurs later than on the tenth day prior to the
15		close of filing for the next succeeding primary
16		election but not later than on the sixtieth day prior
17		to the next succeeding primary election, or if there
18		are no qualified candidates for any party or
19		nonpartisan candidates qualified for the primary
20		election ballot, nominations for the unexpired term
21		may be filed not later than 4:30 p.m. on the fiftieth
22		day prior to the next succeeding primary election.

1		The chief election officer shall issue a proclamation
2		designating the election for filling the vacancy.
3		Pending the election the governor shall make a
4		temporary appointment to fill the vacancy and the
5		person so appointed shall serve until the election of
6		the person duly elected to fill the vacancy. The
7		[appointee shall be of] governor shall make the
8		appointment from a list of five prospective appointees
9		submitted by the same political party [or
10		nonpartisanship] as the [person the appointee
11		succeeds.] vacator. The prospective appointees shall
12		be, at the time of appointment and for at least
13		months immediately prior to the appointment,
14		registered members of the political party. If the
15		vacator is not a member of any political party, the
16		governor shall appoint a person who is not and has not
17		been, for at least months immediately prior to
18		the appointment, a member of any political party;
19	(3)	If it occurs after the sixtieth day prior to the next
20		succeeding primary but not later than on the fiftieth
21		day prior to the next succeeding general election, or
22		if there are no qualified candidates for any party or

1	nonpartisan candidates in the primary, the vacancy
2	shall be filled for the unexpired term at the next
3	succeeding general election. The chief election
4	officer shall issue a proclamation designating the
5	election for filling the vacancy. Party candidates
6	for the unexpired senate term shall be nominated by
7	the county committees of the parties not later than
8	4:30 p.m. on the fortieth day prior to the general
9	election; nonpartisan candidates may file nomination
10	papers for the unexpired term not later than 4:30 p.m.
11	on the fortieth day prior to the general election with
12	the nonpartisan candidate who is to be nominated to be
13	decided by lot, under the supervision of the chief
14	election officer. The candidates for the unexpired
15	term shall be elected in accordance with this title.
16	Pending the election the governor shall make a
17	temporary appointment to fill the vacancy and the
18	person so appointed shall serve until the election of
19	the person duly elected to fill such vacancy. The
20	[appointee shall be of] governor shall make the
21	appointment from a list of five prospective appointees
22	submitted by the same political party [or

1	nonpartisanship] as the [person the appointee
2	succeeds.] vacator. The prospective appointees shall
3	be, at the time of appointment and for at least
4	months immediately prior to the appointment,
5	registered members of the political party. If the
6	vacator is not a member of any political party, the
7	governor shall appoint a person who is not and has not
8	been, for at least months immediately prior to
9	the appointment, a member of any political party; and
10 (4)	If it occurs after the fiftieth day prior to the next
11	succeeding general election or if no candidates are
12	nominated, the governor shall make an appointment to
13	fill the vacancy for the unexpired term [and the
14	appointee shall be of] by selecting a person from a
15	list of five prospective appointees submitted by the
16	same political party [or nonpartisanship] as the
17	[person the appointee succeeds.] vacator. The
18	prospective appointees shall be, at the time of
19	appointment and for at least months immediately
20	prior to the appointment, registered members of the
21	political party. If the vacator is not a member of
22	any political party, the governor shall appoint a

1	person who is not and has not been, for at least
2	months immediately prior to the appointment, a member
3	of any political party."
4	SECTION 3. Section 17-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
5	amended to read as follows:
6	" §17-4 State representatives. (a) Whenever any vacancy
7	in the membership of the state house of representatives occurs,
8	the governor shall make an appointment within sixty calendar
9	days following the first day of vacancy to fill the vacancy for
10	the unexpired term [and the appointee shall be of] by selecting
11	a person from a list of five prospective appointees submitted by
12	the same political party [or nonpartisanship] as the [person the
13	appointee succeeds.] vacator. The prospective appointees shall
14	be, at the time of appointment and for at least months
15	immediately prior to the appointment, registered members of the
16	political party. The political party shall submit the list of
17	prospective appointees to the governor within calendar
18	days following the first day of vacancy.
19	(b) If the vacator is not a member of any political party,
20	the governor shall within sixty calendar days following the
21	first day of vacancy appoint a person who is not and has not

Requires prospective appointees to be registered members of nominating political parties for a certain period of time prior to the appointment.
