A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LEGISLATIVE VACANCIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 17-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "§17-1 United States senator. When a vacancy occurs in
- 4 the office of United States senator, the vacancy shall be filled
- 5 for the unexpired term at the following state general
- election[-]; provided that the vacancy occurs not later than 6
- 4:30 p.m. on the sixtieth day prior to the primary for 7
- 8 nominating candidates to be voted for at the election; otherwise
- at the state general election next following. The chief 9
- 10 election officer shall issue a proclamation designating the
- election for filling the vacancy. Pending the election the 11
- 12 governor shall make a temporary appointment to fill the vacancy
- 13 [and the] by selecting a person from a list of not less than
- 14 three persons submitted by the same political party as the
- 15 person the appointee succeeds. The person so appointed shall
- 16 serve until the election and qualification of the person duly
- elected to fill the vacancy and shall be a registered member of 17
- 18 the same political party as the [senator causing the vacancy.]

18	person the appointee succeeds. The political party
19	shall submit the list of persons to the governor
20	within thirty calendar days following the first day of
21	vacancy. If for any reason the governor fails to
22	appoint a person from the list of persons within the

1		forty calendar days following the first day of
2		vacancy, the president of the senate shall immediately
3		on the first day thereafter fill the vacancy by
4		appointing a person from the list of persons submitted
5		by the political party; and
6	(2)	If the person the appointee succeeds is not a member
7		of any political party, the governor shall within
8		forty calendar days following the first day of vacancy
9		appoint a person who is not a member of any political
10		party from the time prior to when the vacancy is first
11		announced. If for any reason the governor fails to
12		appoint a person within the forty calendar days
13		following the first day of vacancy, the president of
14		the senate shall immediately on the first day
15		thereafter appoint a person who is not a member of any
16		political party from the time prior to when the

2	shall be filled for the unexpired term at the next
3	succeeding general election. The chief election
4	officer shall issue a proclamation designating the
5	election for filling the vacancy. Party candidates
6	for the unexpired senate term shall be nominated by
7	the county committees of the parties not later than
8	4:30 p.m. on the fortieth day prior to the general
9	election; nonpartisan candidates may file nomination
10	papers for the unexpired term not later than 4:30 p.m.
11	on the fortieth day prior to the general election with

1 days following the first day of vacancy to fill the vacancy for 2 the unexpired term [and the appointee shall be of] by selecting 3 a person from a list of not less than three persons submitted by 4 the same political party [or nonpartisanship] as the person the 5 appointee succeeds. The political party shall submit the list of persons to the governor within thirty calendar days following 6 the first day of vacancy. If for any reason the governor fails 7 8 to appoint a person from the list of persons within the forty 9 calendar days following the first day of vacancy, the speaker of **10** the house of representatives shall immediately on the first day 11 thereafter fill the vacancy by appointing a person from the list 12 of persons submitted by the political party. 13 If the person the appointee succeeds is not a member (b) 14 of any political party, the governor shall within forty calendar 15 days following the first day of vacancy appoint a person who is 16 not a member of any political party from the time prior to when 17 the vacancy is first announced. If for any reason the governor 18 fails to appoint a person within the forty calendar days following the first day of vacancy, the speaker of the house of 19 **20** representatives shall immediately on the first day thereafter 21 appoint a person who is not a member of any political party from 22 the time prior to when the vacancy is first announced."

Description:

Requires the Governor, in filling vacancies in the Senate, House of Representatives, and U.S. Senate, to select from a list of individuals nominated by the political party of the person creating the vacancy. Shortens the period in which the Governor must fill a vacancy in the Senate and House of Representatives, from 60 calendar days to 40.
