## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HOUSING.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the cost of living
2	in Hawaii has been and continues to be high. A significant
3	contributing factor to the high cost of living in Hawaii is the
4	high cost of housing, and it is the high cost of land that
5	contributes significantly to the high cost of housing. Land, in
6	common with other natural resources, is a finite resource, a
7	fact particularly obvious in Hawaii. The shortage in the supply
8	of land leads to higher land prices and housing costs and
9	creates a situation in which land is developed for higher-priced
10	housing rather than affordable housing, which has led to the
11	housing crisis the State currently faces. As a result, there is
12	a current lack of desperately needed affordable housing.
13	The urgency of the affordable housing shortage in Hawaii
14	requires immediate state action. A 2003 housing policy study
15	indicated that there will continue to be a need for affordable
16	housing units over the next five years. However, Hawaii's low-
17	and moderate-income families are experiencing difficulties in

- 1 entering the housing market with housing prices at an all-time
  2 high.
  3 The purpose of this Act is to increase the number of
- 4 affordable housing units in Honolulu's urban core, specifically
- 5 the Kakaako development area.
- 6 SECTION 2. Chapter 206E, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 7 amended by adding three new sections to part II to be
- 8 appropriately designated and to read as follows:
- 9 "§206E-A Kakaako affordable housing development program
- 10 established; purpose. (a) There is established the Kakaako
- 11 affordable housing development program within the authority to
- 12 provide affordable housing in the Kakaako community development
- 13 district established pursuant to section 206E-32.
- 14 (b) The purpose of this program shall be to create and
- 15 preserve affordable housing units within Honolulu's urban core;
- 16 provided that funds administered through this program shall not
- 17 be used for residential development in the Kakaako Makai area.
- 18 <u>§206E-B</u> <u>Kakaako affordable housing development fund.</u> (a)
- 19 There is established the Kakaako affordable housing development
- 20 fund. Funds appropriated and all moneys received or collected
- 21 by the authority for the purpose of the fund shall be deposited
- 22 in the fund.

1	(b)	The proceeds in the fund shall be used:
2	(1)	To provide subsidies and other assistance to eligible
3		projects under section 206E-C;
4	(2)	To reimburse the general fund to pay the interest on
5		general obligation bonds issued for the purposes of
6		the fund; and
7	(3)	For the necessary expenses in administering the
8		Kakaako affordable housing development program.
9	<u>§206</u>	E-C Eligible projects. (a) For the purposes of this
10	section,	activities eligible for subsidies and other assistance
11	from the	Kakaako affordable housing development fund shall
12	<u>include</u> n	ew construction, rehabilitation, acquisition, or
13	preservat	ion of multifamily ownership housing units for persons
14	and famil	ies with incomes at or below one hundred forty per cent
15	of the me	dian family income as determined by the United States
16	Departmen	t of Housing and Urban Development that meet the
17	criteria	for eligibility described in subsection (b).
18	(b)	The authority shall establish procedures for the
19	submissio	n of requests for subsidies and other assistance and
20	criteria	for assistance that are consistent with and further the
21	purpose o	f section 206E-A for projects that:
22	(1)	Are at least four stories or higher;

1	(2)	Dedicate at least fifty per cent of their units to
2		persons and families with incomes at or below one
3		hundred forty per cent of the median family income as
4		determined by the United States Department of Housing
5		and Urban Development;
6	(3)	Dedicate at least half of the units as provided in
7		paragraph (2) to persons and families with incomes at
8		or below eighty per cent of the median family income
9		as determined by the United States Department of
10		Housing and Urban Development; and
11	(4)	Are located outside the Kakaako Makai area.
12	The .	authority may by rule include other criteria in the
13	above pro	cess as it deems necessary to carry out the purposes of
14	this sect	ion.
15	(c)	The subsidies and other assistance provided by the
16	authority	shall be limited to:
17	(1)	\$75 per square foot for up to eight hundred square
18		feet per unit; and
19	(2)	No more than one thousand units in the aggregate."
20	SECT	ION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
21	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ , or so
22	much there	eof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2006-2007, to

- 1 be deposited to the Kakaako affordable housing development fund
- 2 for the purposes of section 2.
- 3 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii
- 4 community development authority for the purposes of this Act.
- 5 SECTION 4. Any funds remaining in the Kakaako affordable
- 6 housing development fund on June 30, 2011, shall be returned to
- 7 the general fund.
- 8 SECTION 5. In codifying the new sections added by section
- 9 2 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute
- 10 appropriate section numbers for the letters used in designating
- 11 the new sections in this Act.
- 12 SECTION 6. New statutory material is underscored.
- SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020, and
- 14 shall be repealed on June 30, 2011.
