A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CHARTER SCHOOLS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that lack of facilities 2 funding is a significant financial and operational challenge for 3 new century charter schools. Current funding for new century 4 charter schools is calculated on a per-pupil allocation for each regular education and special education student based upon 5 6 average enrollment in all cost categories, as published in the department of education's consolidated annual financial report. 7 8 However, there is no allocation for charter schools to establish 9 and maintain school facilities. The capacity to provide a long-10 term physical location, infrastructure maintenance, and building 11 improvements contributes to the successful development and 12 stability of individual charter schools. 13 Additionally, due to prohibitive costs and zoning 14 restrictions, public charter schools often have great difficulty 15 leasing affordable lands. The legislature believes that charter 16 schools, as public schools and state agencies, should have 17 access to state-held lands and buildings and enjoy comparable 18 rates and conditions as those afforded other state agencies.

- 1 The purpose of this Act is to provide additional funding 2 for new century charter schools to use for rent or lease costs 3 and repair, maintenance, and improvement costs for charter 4 school facilities, and to encourage the State to enter into 5 long-term leases of public lands and buildings with charter schools for the location of school facilities. 6 7 SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 8 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 9 and to read as follows: 10 "§302A- Facilities funding for new century charter 11 schools. (a) The department of education shall allocate funds 12 to new century charter schools for the purpose of facilities 13 rent or lease costs and repair, maintenance, and improvement 14 costs. The amount provided shall be calculated on a per-pupil 15 basis. The formula for the allocation shall be based on a five-16 year average of the department of education's debt service level 17 as provided in the department's most recent consolidated annual 18 financial report. The allocation for facilities is in addition 19 to any other per-pupil allocation currently authorized under this chapter and received by the charter schools. 20 (b) To enable new century charter schools to access state 21
- funding prior to the start of each school year, foster their

1 fiscal planning, and enhance their accountability, the 2 department shall allocate funds on the same schedule as the per 3 pupil general allocation pursuant to section 302A-1185(c). This section does not apply to new century conversion charter 4 5 schools." SECTION 3. Chapter 171, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 6 7 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to read as follows: 8 9 Lease to public new century charter schools. "§171-10 Notwithstanding any limitations to the contrary, the board of 11 land and natural resources may lease to new century charter schools, at nominal consideration, by direct negotiation and 12 without recourse to public auction, public lands and buildings 13 under the control of the department of land and natural 14 15 resources. Except as provided in this section, the terms and 16 conditions of sections 171-33 and 171-36 shall apply. The lands 17 and buildings leased under this section shall be used by the new 18 century charter schools for educational purposes only. This 19 section shall not apply to new century conversion charter 20 schools." 21 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
