A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE JUDICIARY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Seventy per cent of the State of Hawaii's 2 population resides on Oahu and is served by the first judicial 3 circuit, which consists of twenty-five circuit court judges. The remaining thirty per cent of Hawaii's population is served 4 5 by the second judicial circuit on Maui with four circuit court 6 judges; the third judicial circuit on Hawaii with four circuit 7 court judges; and the fifth judicial circuit on Kauai with two 8 circuit court judges. The citizens of central and leeward Oahu, 9 representing twenty-two per cent of the State's population, and 10 thirty per cent of Oahu's population, have no dedicated circuit 11 court. 12 The legislature is committed to support the anticipated 13 continued growth of central and leeward Oahu with the creation 14 of a "second city" in Kapolei. Consistent with that vision, the legislature, during the 2005 regular session, supported the 15 16 judiciary's request for the construction of a courthouse complex 17 in Kapolei. The legislature's concern over the most efficient 18 way to provide equal access to justice, promote the most

- 1 effective delivery of legal services, and better serve the needs
- 2 of the entire population of Oahu leads to the inevitable
- 3 conclusion that the creation of an additional circuit, to be
- 4 designated the fourth judicial circuit, located in the Kapolei
- 5 court complex, will best accomplish those goals.
- 6 SECTION 2. Section 571-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 "§571-3 Family courts, divisions of circuit courts. The
- 9 family courts shall be divisions of the circuit courts of the
- 10 State and shall not be deemed to be other courts as that term is
- 11 used in the State Constitution. A family court shall be held at
- 12 the courthouse in each circuit, or other duly designated place,
- 13 by the judge or judges of the respective family courts as herein
- 14 defined. The chief justice of the supreme court may temporarily
- 15 assign a family court judge to preside in another circuit when
- 16 the urgency of one or more cases requires the chief justice to
- 17 do so. The first circuit shall retain all matters in the
- 18 present location within the jurisdiction of the family court as
- 19 provided in chapters 571, 580, 586, and 587, except proceedings
- 20 under section 571-11(1), which may be exclusively held in the
- 21 fourth circuit. In any case in which it has jurisdiction, the

- 9 SECTION 10. The sum appropriated shall be expended by the
- 10 judiciary for the purposes of this Act.
- 11 SECTION 11. This Act shall take effect upon the formal
- 12 opening of the Kapolei court complex; provided that section 9
- 13 and section 10 take effect on July 1, 2006.
