A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FIREWORKS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 132D-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended to read as follows: 3 "\$132D-3 Permissible uses of non-aerial common fireworks. 4 Non-aerial common fireworks may be set off, ignited, discharged, 5 or otherwise caused to explode within the State only: 6 From 9:00 p.m. on New Year's Eve to 1:00 a.m. on New (1)7 Year's Day; from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. on Chinese New 8 Year's Day; and from 1:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. on the 9 Fourth of July; or 10 (2) From 9:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. as allowed by permit 11 pursuant to section 132D-10 if the proposed cultural 12 use is to occur at any time other than during the 13 periods prescribed in paragraph (1); 14 provided that the purchase and setting-off, igniting, 15 discharging, or exploding of not more than 5,000 individual non-16 aerial common fireworks commonly known as firecrackers shall be 17 allowed under each permit."
