### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO OCEAN VESSELS.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 200-49, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
2	amended to read as follows:		
3	"§200-49 Disposition of derelict vessel[+] or vessel in		
4	<u>distress.</u> (a) The chairperson may cause a derelict vessel to		
5	be immediately taken into custody. Upon taking custody of a		
6	derelict vessel, the department, as soon as reasonably possible

8	(1) Give public notice of intended disposition and		
9	procedure for requesting an administrative hearing;		
10	(2) When possible, post a notice of intended disposition		
11	and procedure for requesting an administrative hearing		
12	on the vessel; and		
13	(3) Serve a duplicate original of the notice of intended		
14	disposition and procedure for requesting an		
15	administrative hearing by certified mail, return		
16	receipt requested on:		
17	(A) The registered or documented owner of the vessel,		
18	if known, at the owner's last known address on

2		Coast Guard;	
3	(B)	All lien holders who have properly filed a	
4		financing statement, referencing the name of the	
5		registered or documented owner, in the bureau of	
6		conveyances or who are shown on the records of

9	(C)	Any operator of the vessel on record with the	
10		department or the United States Coast Guard.	
11	(b) The owner, lien holder, or operator of $[\frac{\text{the}}{\text{c}}]$ <u>a</u>		
12	derelict vessel shall have ten days after the date of the public		
13	notice or receipt of the mailed notice $[ au]$ pursuant to subsection		
14	(a), whichever occurs later, to request in writing an		
15	administrative hearing. This administrative hearing is solely		
16	for the purpose of allowing the owner, lien holder, or operator		
17	of an impounded vessel to contest the basis given by the		
18	department for the impoundment of the vessel. The hearing		
19	[must] shall be held within five working days of the		
20	department's receipt of the written request.

- 1 mailing of the notice, whichever occurs later, [the vessel] may
- 2 be disposed of by negotiated sale except that, when two or more
- 3 purchasers indicate an interest in purchasing the vessel, the
- 4 vessel [will] shall be sold at public auction to the highest
- 5 bidder, unless the vessel is exempt from public auction under
- 6 section 200-45. If no purchaser expresses a desire to purchase
- 7 the vessel, the vessel may be destroyed or donated to any
- 8 governmental agency.
- **9** (d) Within twenty-four hours of obtaining the written
