A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 88-75, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 amended to read as follows: 2 3 "§88-75 Ordinary disability retirement. (a) Upon application of a member in service or on leave without pay, or 4 5 the person appointed by the family court as guardian of an 6 incapacitated member, any member who has ten or more years of credited service shall be retired by the board [of trustees] on 7 an ordinary disability retirement allowance if the medical 8 9 board, after a medical examination of the member, certifies 10 that: 11 The member is mentally or physically incapacitated for (1)the further performance of duty at the time of 12 application; 13 14 The incapacity is likely to be permanent; and (2) 15 (3) The member should be retired. 16 Notwithstanding the requirement of subsection (a)(1), (b) if a member applying for ordinary disability retirement suffers 17 from the symptoms of an incurable debilitating disease that has 18

1 not progressed to the extent that the member's physical or mental condition has deteriorated so as to require the member to 2 immediately retire, the medical board shall render a decision on 3 the member's eligibility for retirement within thirty days of 4 the medical board's receipt of a written statement, from the 5 6 member's primary care physician or a physician who specializes in the diagnosis of the incurable debilitating disease, 7 certifying that the member suffers from the symptoms of an 8 incurable debilitating disease. Within thirty days of the 9 10 medical board's decision on whether a member's medical condition 11 qualifies as an incurable debilitating disease, the system shall 12 render a decision on the member's retirement application and 13 notify the member of the system's decision. (c) No time limit for retirement from the system shall be 14 imposed upon a member who qualifies for ordinary disability 15 retirement under subsection (b), and the member may continue in 16 the member's public sector employment until such time as the 17 18 member elects to terminate service and retire. 19 For the purposes of this section, "incurable debilitating 20 disease" means a disease that:
