A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. Section 88-75, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended to read as follows:

 "\$88-75 Ordinary disability retirement. (a) Upon
 application of a member in service or on leave without pay, or
- 5 the person appointed by the family court as guardian of an
- $oldsymbol{6}$ incapacitated member, any member who has ten or more years of
- 7 credited service shall be retired by the board [of trustees] on
- 8 an ordinary disability retirement allowance if the medical board
- 9 after a medical examination of the member certifies that:
- 10 (1) The member is mentally or physically incapacitated for

 11 the further performance of duty at the time of

 12 application;
- 13 (2) The incapacity is likely to be permanent; and
- 14 (3) The member should be retired.
- (b) Upon approval by the board, the member shall be
- 16 eligible to receive an ordinary disability retirement benefit no
- 17 earlier than thirty days from the date the application was filed
- 18 or the date the member terminated service, whichever is later.
