A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Findings and purpose. The legislature finds
2	that with in-migration and the aging of our population, among
3	other things, the demographics of the State are evolving. Over
4	the past twenty-five years, the statewide population has
5	increasingly shifted from the urban core to the suburbs,
6	especially on Oahu, where the population center has steadily
7	moved to the western side of the island. Meanwhile, some of the
8	areas in the State with the fastest-growing populations are
9	Kihei, Maui, and west Hawaii. These demographic shifts have
10	overburdened public school facilities in growing areas and left
11	some public school facilities in other areas underutilized.
12	Thus, the legislature believes there is a need to revitalize
13	school facilities statewide, including building or expanding
14	schools in certain areas and consolidating or closing schools in
15	other areas.
16	However, the legislature finds that despite broad-based
17	public recognition of Hawaii's changing demographics, there is
18	often little public support for changes that affect specific

- 1 constituencies. In particular, this is true of proposals to
- 2 close or consolidate underutilized public schools to maximize
- 3 resources.
- 4 The legislature recognizes the difficulties, political and
- 5 otherwise, inherent in these decisions. But in the face of
- 6 increasing educational priorities, the legislature believes that
- 7 just as the construction or expansion of some schools is
- 8 important, the consolidation or closure of underutilized schools
- 9 is also necessary. It is important that any actions to do so be
- 10 taken through a very objective and transparent process that
- 11 benefits the greatest number of public school students and their
- 12 families.
- 13 The purpose of this Act is to revitalize school facilities
- 14 statewide and to more effectively and efficiently use our
- 15 taxpayers' investment in public education. Specifically, this
- 16 Act provides for the timely construction, expansion,
- 17 consolidation, or closure of underutilized public schools in
- 18 Hawaii through an objective and transparent process that:
- 19 (1) Includes the establishment of a facilities alignment
- commission that shall:

1		(A)	Establish criteria for the selection of public
2			schools to be constructed, expanded,
3			consolidated, or closed; and
4		(B)	Recommend, based upon these criteria, a list of
5			areas for new school construction, and of schools
6			for expansion, consolidation, or closure, which
7			is subject to the review of the legislature; and
8	(2)	Dire	cts the board of education to proceed with the
9		proc	ess of constructing, expanding, consolidating, or
10		clos	ing underutilized schools according to the
11		reco	mmendations of the facilities alignment
12		comm:	ission.
13	SECT	ION 2	. Facilities alignment commission. (a) There is
14	establish	ed the	e facilities alignment commission, to be attached
15	to the dep	partme	ent of education for administrative purposes. The
16	commission	n shal	l be composed of nine members appointed by the
17	governor;	provi	ded that:
18	(1)	Three	e members shall be appointed from a list of
19		nomir	nees submitted by the president of the senate, of
20		which	two shall be persons with professional
21		exper	rience in education, including former or current
22		teach	ers or administrators; and

1	(2)	Three members shall be appointed from a list of
2		nominees submitted by the speaker of the house of
3		representatives, of which two shall be persons with
4		professional experience in education, including former
5		or current teachers or administrators.

- 6 (b) The chairperson of the commission shall be selected by7 the members of the commission.
- 8 (c) A majority of the commission's membership shall be
 9 comprised of persons with professional experience in education,
 10 including current or former teachers or administrators.
- (d) At least one member shall be a representative of thedepartment of education.
- (e) With the sole exception of those who are education
 professionals, members of the commission shall not be employees
 of the State.
- (f) Any substantive action taken by the commission

 pursuant to sections 4 through 6 of this Act shall be approved

 by a two-thirds vote of its members. For all other actions of

 the commission, five members shall constitute a quorum to do

 business, of which a majority vote shall suffice.

- 1 (g) The commission shall be exempt from chapter 91, Hawaii
- 2 Revised Statutes, but shall be subject to chapters 92 and 92F,
- 3 Hawaii Revised Statutes.
- 4 (h) The members of the commission shall serve without
- 5 compensation but shall be reimbursed for expenses necessary for
- 6 the performance of their duties, including travel expenses.
- 7 (i) The department of education shall provide
- 8 administrative support to the commission. The commission shall
- 9 have access to all records in the department of education and
- 10 department of accounting and general services pertinent to its
- 11 duties and may request research and analysis assistance from the
- 12 department of education. Pursuant to chapter 92F, Hawaii
- 13 Revised Statutes, the commission shall maintain the
- 14 confidentiality of all confidential information.
- 15 (j) The commission shall terminate upon adjournment of the
- 16 regular legislative session of 2008, sine die.
- 17 SECTION 3. Procedures for making recommendations for
- 18 school alignment; school facilities plan. (a) The department
- 19 of education shall submit to the commission by August 31, 2006,
- 20 a thirty-year school facilities plan. The school facilities
- 21 plan shall be based on the department's assessment of the
- 22 projected student enrollment for every public school in the

1	State, ot	her than for charter schools. In conducting the
2	assessmen	t, the department shall:
3	(1)	Consider the six-year program and financial plan
4		prepared pursuant to section 37-69, Hawaii Revised
5		Statutes, to the extent it is applicable;
6	(2)	Develop and consider a thirty-year projection of the
7		enrollment at each school across the State and the
8		resulting need for facilities; and
9	(3)	Consider other reliable data relative to population
10		growth and trends, and anticipated levels of funding
11		necessary for every school.
12	(b)	The school facilities plan shall include:
13	(1)	A description of the assessment of projected student
14		enrollment pursuant to subsection (a);
15	(2)	A comprehensive inventory of all department of
16		education facilities;
17	(3)	For each school district, thirty-year projections for
18		the numbers and locations of schools required annually
19		to accommodate the numbers and types of students in
20		the projected enrollment; and
21	(4)	Recommendations for the construction, expansion,

2		to this section.
3	SECT	ION 4. School alignment selection criteria. (a) By
4	December	31, 2006, the commission shall establish the criteria
5	that will	be used by the commission to select:
6	(1)	Areas for new school construction;
7	(2)	Schools for expansion, other than charter schools;
8	(3)	Schools to be consolidated, other than charter
9		schools; and
10	(4)	Underutilized schools to be closed, other than charter
11		schools.
12	The o	criteria shall require the consideration of:
13	(1)	The overutilization or underutilization of school
14		facilities;
15	(2)	The academic and extracurricular achievement or
16		successes of the student body, and whether such
17		success was due at least in part to the existing size
18		of the school;
19	(3)	The best interests of the students and preserving
20		their potential for success;
21	(4)	The impact of the consolidation or closure of a school
22		on the community in which it is located: and

1	(5)	The costs or savings resulting from the continued
2		operation, consolidation, or closure of a school,
3		including the costs of deferred and future repair and
4		maintenance.
5	(b)	Before finalizing the school alignment selection
6	criteria,	the commission shall hold public hearings to obtain
7	public re	sponse to the commission's proposed criteria. For each
8	public hea	aring, the commission shall provide appropriate notice,
9	as define	d in section 1-28.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, both
10	statewide	and county-wide in each county of the State. The
11	commission	n shall make available to the public draft copies of
12	its propos	sed criteria not less than two weeks prior to the start
13	of the pul	olic hearings.
14	SECT	ION 5. Preliminary recommendations. (a) By
15	February 2	28, 2007, based on the school facilities plan developed
16	pursuant t	to section 3 and the final school alignment selection
17	criteria a	adopted pursuant to section 4, the commission shall
18	compile a	preliminary list of recommended:
19	(1)	Areas for new school construction;
20	(2)	Schools for expansion, other than charter schools;
21	(3)	Schools to be consolidated, other than charter
22		schools; and

- (4) Underutilized schools to be closed, other than charter
 schools.
- 3 (b) The list of recommendations shall include a summary of
- 4 the selection process that resulted in the recommendation of
- 5 each area or school on the list, including a justification for
- 6 each recommendation.
- 7 (c) In selecting areas and schools for the list, the
- 8 commission shall consider equally all schools within the State,
- 9 without regard to whether the board of education had previously
- 10 considered the school for consolidation or closure.
- 11 SECTION 6. Public hearings and final recommendations by
- 12 the commission. (a) By August 31, 2007, the commission shall
- 13 hold public hearings to obtain public response to the
- 14 commission's preliminary recommendations. For each public
- 15 hearing, the commission shall provide appropriate notice as
- 16 defined in section 1-28.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, both
- 17 statewide and county-wide in each county of the State. The
- 18 commission shall make available to the public draft copies of
- 19 the preliminary recommendations not less than two weeks prior to
- 20 the start of the public hearings.
- 21 (b) Not less than twenty days prior to the convening of
- 22 the regular session of 2008, the commission shall submit to the

1 legislature a report of its findings and conclusions, including 2 a final list of recommendations for: 3 (1) Areas for new school construction; 4 (2) Schools for expansion, other than charter schools; 5 (3) Schools to be consolidated, other than charter schools; and 6 7 (4)Underutilized schools to be closed, other than charter 8 schools. 9 The final list of recommendations shall be subject to **10** legislative disapproval only in its entirety, by concurrent 11 resolution. 12 If the legislature does not disapprove the 13 recommendations pursuant to subsection (c), then after the 14 adjournment of the regular legislative session of 2008, sine 15 die, the board of education shall begin implementing the 16 recommendations of the commission for the 2009-2010 school year 17 to: 18 (1) Construct new schools; 19 (2) Expand schools; and 20 (3) Consolidate or close underutilized schools.

SECTION 7. There is appropriated out of the general

revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$

- 6 SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.

Report Title:

School Facilities; Facilities Alignment Commission

Description:

Creates the facilities alignment commission to revitalize school facilities by developing and submitting recommendations for areas for new school construction, schools for expansion, and schools for consolidation or closure. Allows the Legislature to disapprove these recommendations only in their entirety. If no legislative disapproval occurs, requires the Board of Education to comply with these recommendations. (SD1)
