A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ESTABLISHMENT OF THE NATURAL ENERGY LABORATORY OF HAWAII AUTHORITY INNOVATION CORPORATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to establish, under
2	Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as
3	amended, a not-for-profit natural energy laboratory of Hawaii
4	authority innovation corporation that is attached to the natural
5	energy laboratory of Hawaii authority.
6	SECTION 2. Chapter 227D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
7	amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and
8	to read as follows:
9	"PART . NATURAL ENERGY LABORATORY OF HAWAII AUTHORITY
10	INNOVATION CORPORATION
11	§227D- Establishment of the natural energy laboratory of
12	Hawaii authority innovation corporation; purpose; duties. (a)
13	There is established, as a body corporate, the natural energy
14	laboratory of Hawaii authority innovation corporation. For the
15	purposes of this part, "corporation" means the natural energy
16	laboratory of Hawaii authority innovation corporation. The
17	corporation shall be a public, not-for-profit organization under

- 1 Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as
- 2 amended. The corporation shall be attached to the department of
- 3 business, economic development, and tourism for administrative
- 4 purposes.
- 5 (b) The purpose of the corporation shall include but not
- 6 be limited to the facilitation of the growth and prosperity of
- 7 the State's economy by providing resources for alternative
- 8 energy research and development. The corporation shall
- 9 implement this purpose by:
- 10 (1) Furnishing the means, methods, and agencies by which
- management, programming, training, investigation,
- research, and analysis may be conducted;
- (2) Other means to make the benefits of programming,
- 14 training, investigation, research, and analysis
- available to the public; and
- 16 (3) Any and all other acts reasonably designed to promote
- 17 the foregoing purposes in the interest of promoting
- the general welfare of the people of the state.
- 19 (c) The corporation's duties shall include but not be
- 20 limited to:
- 21 (1) Managing the assets and resources of the corporation,
- including its land, facilities, and other resources;

1	(2)	Planning, creating, and implementing any programs and
2		projects of the authority that shall be assigned to
3		the corporation, including federally and state-funded
4		programs and projects and programs funded by other
5		nonprofit and for-profit organizations;
6	(3)	Identifying and obtaining funding and other resources
7		in support of the purposes of the corporation from
8		agencies and organizations not able to provide
9		resources directly to the authority;
10	(4)	Assisting the authority in the promotion and marketing
11		of Hawaii as a location for research and commercial
12		natural energy activity; and
13	(5)	Assisting the authority in any other strategic or
14		operational manner that supports the State's energy-
15		based economic development activities.
16	The o	corporation shall have the sole right to provide the
17	foregoing	services and support to the authority, and the
18	authority	shall use the corporation to provide these services
19	and suppor	rt except when the authority determines that the
20	corporation	on may not or cannot legally or operationally provide
21	these serv	vices and support.

- 1 Board of directors; composition. \$227D-The affairs of the corporation shall be under the general management 2 and control of a board of directors consisting of nine members. 3 4 Four members of the board of directors of the authority shall be 5 ex officio, voting members of the corporation's board, selected by the authority's board of directors for terms to be determined 6 by the authority's board of directors. The chief executive 7 officer of the authority shall serve as an ex officio, nonvoting 8 member of the corporation's board. The remaining four members 9 shall be appointed by the governor from lists of nominees 10 provided by the president of the senate and the speaker of the 11 house of representatives. The governor shall appoint two 12 persons from the list submitted by the president of the senate 13 and two persons from the list submitted by the speaker of the 14 house of representatives. The lists of nominees provided by the 15 president of the senate and the speaker of the house of 16 representatives shall consist of members of the general public 17 who were selected on the basis of their knowledge, interest, and 18 proven expertise in but not limited to one or more of the 19 20 following fields: 21 (1)Finance;

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    All the members appointed from the general public shall serve
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    for a term of four years, except that half of those initially
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    appointed from the public may have reduced terms so as to
    provide, as nearly as can be, for the expiration of an equal
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    number of terms at intervals of one year, with each term
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    commencing on July 1 and expiring on June 30.
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              All members of the corporation's board shall serve
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    without pay, but shall be entitled to reimbursement for
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    necessary expenses, including travel expenses, while attending
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    meetings and while in the discharge of duties and
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    responsibilities.

3	§ 227 1	Powers of the corporation. The corporation,
4	under the	direction of its board of directors, shall have the
5	following	general powers and duties:
6	(1)	To promote the use of alternative energy and natural
7		resource sites for the purposes provided by law;
8	(2)	To adopt, amend, and repeal bylaws governing the
9		conduct of its business and the exercise of the powers
10		and performance of duties granted to or imposed upon
11		it by law;
12	(3)	To acquire, own, lease, rent, hold, maintain and
13		improve, use, and operate any property, including
14		real, personal, mixed, tangible, or intangible
15		property, in accordance with the conditions under
16		which the property was received;
17	(4)	To enter into and perform contracts, leases,
18		cooperative agreements, or other transactions with the
19		authority or any other agency or political subdivision
20		of the State, any private person, firm, partnership,
21		association, company, or corporation, as it may be

(c) The members of the corporation's board shall elect the

1	necessary in the conduct of its business and on terms
2	as it may deem appropriate; provided that:
3	(A) The corporation shall not obligate any funds of

- (A) The corporation shall not obligate any funds of the State except funds that have been appropriated to it by the legislature or transferred or contracted to it by the authority or other agency or department of state government;
- (B) Notwithstanding subparagraph (A), the corporation may enter into and perform contracts, leases, cooperative agreements, or other transactions with any agency or instrumentality of the United States, a foreign nation, a state, a territory, or a possession, or with any political subdivision thereof, whenever the donating or granting agency or instrumentality determines that the natural energy laboratory of Hawaii authority or any other agency of the State cannot as effectively and efficiently accomplish the purposes for which the contracts, leases, cooperative agreements, or other transactions are being entered into; and provided further that the

1		corporation shall not obligate any funds of the	
2		State except funds that have been appropriated or	
3		transferred or contracted to it; and	
4		(C) The corporation shall not contract with the	
5		authority for the purposes of providing any	
6		services provided by employees of the authority,	
7		the services and employees shall remain under the	
8		jurisdiction of the authority;	
9	(5)	To receive from private sources only, gifts, grants,	
10		devises, bequests, or otherwise of any property,	
11		including real, personal, mixed, intangible, or	
12		tangible property, held absolutely or in trust, the	
13		principal or income from which may be used and	
14		disposed of, in accordance with the conditions under	
15		which the property was received; provided that no gift	
16		to the corporation shall be accepted unless approved	
17		or confirmed by its board of directors;	
18	(6)	The corporation may receive gifts, grants, or awards	
19		from any agency or instrumentality of the United	
20		States, a foreign nation, a state, a territory, or a	
21		possession, or from any political subdivision thereof,	

whenever the donating or granting agency or

1		instrumentality determines that the authority of any
2		other agency of the State cannot as effectively and
3		efficiently accomplish the purposes for which the
4		gifts, grants, or awards are being made; provided that
5		no gift to the corporation shall be accepted unless
6		approved or confirmed by its board of directors;
7	(7)	To have a corporate seal and alter the same at its
8		pleasure;
9	(8)	To sue and be sued in its own name;
10	(9)	To serve as trustee or beneficiary under terms of any
11		gift, indenture, or will;
12	(10)	To apply for, take out, receive by purchase or gift,
13		hold, administer, and dispose of copyrights, patent
14		rights, licenses, assignments of inventions,
15		discoveries, processes, and other property, rights, or
16		interests therein, and the income thereof, absolutely
17		or subject to conditions or trusts as may be attached
18		thereto or be imposed thereon, and to obligate itself
19		to perform and execute any and all conditions or
20		trusts;

1	(T T)	To conduct programs, projects, research, studies,	
2		experiments, investigations, and tests in all fields	
3		of knowledge to:	
4		(A) Promote and develop the scientific and commercial	
5		value of inventions, discoveries, and processes;	
6		and	
7		(B) Make, publish, and distribute the results	
8		thereof;	
9	(12)	To coordinate and correlate activities and projects of	
10		the corporation with the work of state agencies for	
11		the purpose of relating research work to the economic	
12		development of the state whenever practical or	
13		desirable;	
14	(13)	To stimulate and promote commercial, energy,	
15		aquaculture, and research projects and activities;	
16	(14)	To establish and maintain, or to assist in	
17		establishing and maintaining, staff positions for the	
18		purpose of aiding in energy-based economic development	
19		and to enter into agreements or contracts with other	
20		corporations, organizations, institutions, or persons	
21		for this purpose and to pay the necessary and	
22		appropriate expenses therefor;	

1	(15)	To prepare, print, or publish any manuscript, research
2		article, report, study, discussion, reference,
3		collection, or any pictorial or schematic
4		representation or group or collection thereof, whether
5		the same belongs to or is the work of any state agency
6		or its employees, or the corporation or its employees
7		or a contractor of the authority. The printing or
8		publication may be accomplished through whatever
9		person, company, or agency is deemed most appropriate
10		by the corporation's board of directors; and
11	(16)	To do any or all other acts reasonably necessary to
12		carry out the objectives and purposes of the
13		authority.
14	§227	D- Corporation; exempted from certain state laws.
15	To carry	out the purposes and objectives of this part, the
16	corporati	on shall be granted flexibility in hiring its personnel
17	and in ha	ndling and disbursing moneys by being exempt from the
18	following	state laws:
19	(1)	Sections 36-27 and 36-30, relating to special fund
20		central services expenses and reimbursements for
21		departmental administrative expenses;
22	(2)	Chapter 40, related to public audit and accounting;

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Section 78-1, relating to public employment; and 2 (4)Chapter 103D, relating to public procurement. 3 (5)4 Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, the natural 5 energy laboratory of Hawaii authority innovation corporation shall be authorized to set up private accounts for depositing 6 moneys received from either public or private contracts, or from 7 8 private or public grants, awards, or gifts. All disbursements shall be drawn on these accounts upon checks prepared and signed 9 as approved by the chief executive officer or other person 10 authorized by the board of directors of the natural energy 11 12 laboratory of Hawaii authority innovation corporation. Officers and employees of the corporation. 13 \$227Dchief executive officer of the authority shall be the president 14 of the corporation. The corporation's president, with the 15 16 agreement of the corporation's board of directors, may also appoint other officers and employees as may be necessary in 17 18 administering the affairs of the corporation. The corporation's 19 president, with the agreement of the corporation's board of directors, shall set the employees' duties, responsibilities, 20 salaries, holidays, vacation, leave, hours of work, and working 21 22 conditions and may grant other benefits it deems necessary.

Chapter 76, relating to civil service;

- 1 Employees of the corporation shall not be entitled to any
- 2 benefits conferred under chapter 76, 78, 88, 89 or any public
- 3 employee collective bargaining agreement, executive order,
- 4 executive directive, or rule.
- 5 §227D- Annual report. The corporation shall submit an
- 6 annual report, not later than twenty days prior to the convening
- 7 of each regular session, to the governor, president of the
- 8 senate, and the speaker of the house of representatives. The
- 9 report shall include but not be limited to the corporation's
- 10 audited financial statement, total amount of payroll and other
- 11 disbursements made, and progress and accomplishments made during
- 12 the year.
- 13 §227D- Dissolution. If the corporation is dissolved,
- 14 all of its property, including real, personal, and mixed
- 15 property, wheresoever situated, shall vest immediately and
- 16 absolutely in the authority, and none of its property shall
- 17 inure to the benefit of any officer, director, or member of the
- 18 corporation.
- 19 §227D- Meetings of the board. The meetings of the
- 20 corporation's board shall be open to the public as provided in
- 21 section 92-3, except that when it is necessary for the board to
- 22 receive information that:

1	(1) Is pr	oprietary to a particular enterprise seeking
2	entry	into or use of one of the corporation's
3	facil	ities; and
4	(2) Might	be harmful to the business interest of the
5	enter	prise if disclosed,
6	the board may e	nter into an executive meeting that is closed to
7	the public; pro	vided that the executive meeting shall be limited
8	to discussion o	r consideration of trade secrets or confidential
9	or proprietary	commercial or financial information to the extent
10	that the trade	secrets or information fall within the exception
11	to public discl	osure under section 92F-13.
12	§227D-	Confidentiality of information. Any government
13	record made or	received by any member or employee of the
14	corporation sha	ll be subject to segregation and kept
15	confidential to	the extent permitted under chapter 92F; provided
16	that the inform	ation:
17	(1) Consi	sts of business trade secrets; or
18	(2) Consi	sts of confidential or proprietary commercial or
19	finan	cial information regarding the operation of any
20	busin	ess.
21	§227D- Pa	atents, copyrights, and other rights. Any

patents, copyrights, inventions, discoveries, or other rights

- 1 arising from corporation activities shall belong to the
- 2 corporation and be subject to policies or rules as the
- 3 corporation's board of directors may adopt pursuant to chapter
- 4 91.
- 5 §227D- Contracts with state agencies. Any contract
- 6 between the corporation and any agency, office, department, or
- 7 other administrative subdivision of the executive branch of the
- 8 State shall include the following:
- 9 (1) The contract's termination date;
- 10 (2) The contract's intent and purpose;
- 11 (3) A statement establishing the full permissible extent
- of the contract's applicability; and
- 13 (4) A description of the circumstances under which the
- 14 contract may be amended or extended."
- 15 SECTION 3. Chapter 227D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 16 amended by designating sections 227D-1 to 227D-9 as part I and
- 17 inserting a title before section 227D-1 to read as follows:
- 18 "PART I. GENERAL AND ADMINISTRATIVE PROVISIONS."
- 19 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
- 20 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
