### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HUMAN SERVICES.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that it is critical to 2 achieve universal health coverage for Hawaii's residents. 3 Hawaii's QUEST program goes a long way toward this goal. However, the program cannot handle all eligible uninsured adults 4 5 and a cap has been placed on participation in the QUEST program, 6 thus leaving out tens of thousands of eligible uninsured adults. 7 The current cap prevents many adults, especially nonpregnant women, who are income- and asset-eligible from 8 enrolling in the program. These excluded but eliqible adults 9 10 are at high risk for not getting necessary primary and preventive care, not getting necessary prescription drugs, and 11 12 are more likely to incur or generate unnecessary emergency room costs because of their uninsured status. Uninsured adults are a 13 14 financial burden on hospitals, emergency rooms, community health 15 care centers, and others that provide uncompensated care. 16 The legislature further finds that almost fifty-four per cent of the funds needed to cover all eligible adults under the 17

QUEST program can be matched by the federal government.

- 5 health coverage in Hawaii by expanding enrollment in the State's

- 9 SECTION 2. OUEST maximum enrollment; rules. (a) The
- 10 director of human services shall increase maximum statewide
- 11 enrollment in the State's QUEST program to one hundred fifty
- 12 thousand enrollees.
- 13 (b) The director of human services shall immediately adopt
- 14 rules to implement this section pursuant to chapter 91, Hawaii
- 15 Revised Statutes; provided that the director shall have the
- 16 power to issue interim rules that shall be exempt from the
- 17 public notice, public hearing, and gubernatorial approval
- 18 requirements of chapter 91, Hawaii Revised Statutes. Any
- 19 interim rules adopted under this section shall be effective for
- 20 not more than eighteen months.
- 21 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 22 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ , or so

- 1 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2006-2007, for
- 2 increasing maximum enrollment in the State's QUEST program to
- 3 one hundred fifty thousand enrollees.
- 4 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 5 human services for the purposes of this Act.
- 6 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval,
- 7 except that section 3 shall take effect on July 1, 2006.
