A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EMPLOYMENT SECURITY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Act 249, Session Laws of Hawaii 2005, is
2	amended by amending section 3 to read as follows:
3	"SECTION 3. There is appropriated from the unemployment
4	insurance trust fund from moneys deposited pursuant to section
5	383-123(b) the sum of [\$10,000,000, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary for fiscal year 2005-2006, and the same sum,
7	\$20,000,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
8	year 2006-2007, for the purposes specified in this Act[$ au$
9	provided that of the \$10,000,000 appropriated for each fiscal
10	<pre>year:] as follows:</pre>
11	(1) The sum of:
12	(A) $[\$4,795,000]$ $\$9,590,000$ shall be allocated to the
13	[city and county of Honolulu's workforce
14	investment board; provided that the workforce
15	investment board shall partner with the Leeward
16	community college to provide federal
17	Wagner-Peyser services for immigrants from the
18	Freely Associated States, pursuant to the

I		workforce development program established under
2		Act 225, Session Laws of Hawaii 2004; city and
3		county of Honolulu in collaboration with the Oahu
4		workforce investment board;
5	(B)	[\$1,252,775] $$2,505,550$ shall be allocated to the
6		[county of Maui's workforce investment board;
7		county of Maui in collaboration with the Maui
8		workforce investment board;
9	(C)	[\$1,000,000] $$2,000,000$ shall be allocated to the
10		[county of Kauai's workforce investment board;
11		county of Kauai in collaboration with the Kauai
12		workforce investment board; and
13	(D)	[\$1,650,000] $$3,300,000$ shall be allocated to the
14		[county of Hawaii's workforce investment board;
15		provided that the workforce investment board
16		shall partner with the department of labor and
17		industrial relations, workforce development
18		division, to provide federal Wagner-Peyser
19		services for the eradication of coqui frogs
20		and/or other invasive species and to serve
21		residents of Hamakua, Waimea, Kohala, and

1		Waikoloa; county of Hawaii in collaboration with	
2		the Hawaii workforce investment board;	
3		to improve employer outreach and services, labor force	
4		pool expansion, capacity building, and to fund some	
5		shared costs for the operations of the one-stop career	
6		centers within each county; and	
7	(2)	The sum of $[\$1,302,225]$ $\$2,604,450$ shall be allocated	
8		to the department of labor and industrial relations to	
9		be used by the department of labor and industrial	
10		relations, in consultation with local workforce	
11		investment boards of each of the four counties, to	
12		plan, develop, and implement a computer system that	
13		benefits workforce development activities and programs	
14		operated by the counties.	
15	The	sums appropriated shall be expended by the department	
16	of labor	and industrial relations for the purposes of this Act."

19	[" SE (CTION 4. No funds appropriated under section 3 to the	
20	department of labor and industrial relations for use by the

- 13 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2006.

Report Title:

Workforce Development; Unemployment Trust Fund; Reed Act Funds; Appropriation

Description:

Increases the amount of federal Reed Act funds previously appropriated for fiscal year 2006-2007. Replaces the workforce investment boards with the counties as recipients of the funds. Requires the counties to work in collaboration with workforce investment boards. Removes the timeline requirement for the release of funds under Act 249, SLH 2005. (SD2)
