1	SECT	ION 1. Chapter 46, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
2	by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to	
3	read as follows:	
4	" <u>§46</u>	Use of pervious pavement. (a) Effective
5	January 1	, 2008, no county agency shall issue a permit for new
6	residential, commercial, or public construction unless all	
7	pavement used in the construction consists of pervious pavement;	
8	provided that pervious pavement shall not be required where its	
9	use:	
10	(1)	Would threaten existing water quality or public health
11		and safety, as determined by the department of health;
12		<u>or</u>
13	(2)	Would seriously threaten permitted ground or surface
14		water uses within a designated water management area,
15		as determined by the commission on water resource
16		management.
17	(b)	For the purposes of this section:

1	"Pavement" includes sidewalks, driveways, and roads but		
2	excludes the foundation of a building.		
3	"Pervious pavement" includes but is not limited to cement		
4	blends, grasscrete, gravel, and other materials with the ability		
5	<u>to:</u>		
6	(1) Allow water to seep through the paved surface and into		
7	the soil as nature intended; and		
8	(2) Reduce or eliminate the need and the cost of expensive		
9	stormwater drainage systems and retention areas."		
10	SECTION 2. New statutory material is underscored.		
11	SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Description:

Mandates that counties require the use of pervious pavement for all new development to allow rainwater to pass directly through the pavement and into the soil naturally.
