A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PRESCRIPTION DRUGS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. Act 241, Session Laws of Hawaii 2005, added a 1 2 new part to chapter 346, Hawaii Revised Statutes, titled 3 "MEDICAID PREAUTHORIZATION EXEMPTION", which consists of two sections codified as sections 346-351 and 346-352, Hawaii 4 5 Revised Statutes. Section 346-352 exempts the OUEST medical 6 plans from the provisions of the section and thereby restricts 7 access of medicaid recipients to immunosuppressant medication. 8 The purpose of this Act is to remove the QUEST medical 9 plans exemption in section 346-352. Deletion of this exemption 10 will provide equal access when it comes to providing open, 11 unrestricted access to medications for medicaid clients who suffer from human immunodeficiency virus, acquired immune 12 13 deficiency syndrome, or hepatitis C, or who need 14 immunosuppressives as a result of organ transplants, regardless **15** of whether they are in the medicaid fee-for-service or the 16 medicaid QUEST programs.
- 17 SECTION 2. Section 346-352, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

- 1 "[+]§346-352[+] Preauthorization exemption for certain
- 2 physicians. Any physician licensed in this State who treats a
- 3 medicaid recipient patient suffering from the human
- 4 immunodeficiency virus, acquired immune deficiency syndrome, or
- 5 hepatitis C, or who is a patient in need of transplant
- 6 immunosuppressives, may prescribe any medications approved by
- 7 the United States Food and Drug Administration and that are
- 8 eligible for Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Rebates Act (OBRA),
- 9 that are necessary to treat the condition, without having to
- 10 comply with the requirements of any preauthorization procedure
- 11 established by any other provision of this chapter. [This
- 12 section shall not apply to QUEST medical plans.]
- 13 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 14 and stricken.
- 15 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
