A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PSYCHOTROPIC MEDICATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature passed Act 239, Session Laws of 2 Hawaii 2005, in recognition of the importance of providing open 3 access to medications utilized to treat mental illness. Act 239, Session Laws of 2005, applied to medicaid eligible 4 5 individuals. The legislature finds that Act 239 has been successful in treating mental illness and further finds that all 6 7 individuals participating in all Hawaii medicaid medical plans should have access to the same benefits. 8 9 The purpose of this Act is to improve access to 10 psychotropic medication for participants in all Hawaii medicaid 11 medical plans. 12 SECTION 2. Act 239, Session Laws of Hawaii 2005, is 13 amended by amending sections 2 and 3 to read as follows: 14 "SECTION 2. Chapter 346, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 15 amended by adding two new sections to be appropriately 16 designated and to read as follows:
- 17 "\$346- Psychotropic medication. (a) The department
 18 shall not impose any restriction or limitation on the coverage
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- 1 for, or a recipient's access to, psychotropic medication;
- 2 provided that the psychotropic medication shall be prescribed by
- 3 a licensed psychiatrist or by a licensed physician [in
- 4 consultation with a psychiatrist] duly licensed in the State.
- 5 (b) As used in this section:
- 6 ["Consultation" means communication by telephone,
- 7 electronically, or face to face by a licensed psychiatrist and a
- 8 licensed physician, during which the psychiatrist concurs with
- 9 the prescription made. The psychiatrist's concurring opinion
- 10 shall be documented in the recipient's medical record.
- 11 "Psychotropic medication" means only those agents approved
- 12 by the United States Food and Drug Administration for the
- 13 treatment of mental or emotional disorders.
- 14 (c) This section shall [not] apply to [QUEST] all Hawaii
- 15 medicaid medical plans.
- 16 §346- Pre-authorization exemption for psychotropic
- 17 medication. (a) A licensed physician may prescribe
- 18 psychotropic medication pursuant to the laws of this State to an
- 19 individual who is medicaid eligible without the requirement of
- 20 any preauthorization procedure otherwise required by any other
- 21 provision of this chapter; provided that the individual is in
- 22 need of emergency psychiatric or psychological service.

(b) As used in this section: 1 "Emergency psychiatric or psychological service" means 2 immediate administration or prescription of psychotropic 3 4 medication not to exceed seven days by a licensed physician is 5 required to avoid or mitigate significant adverse effects to the individual's mental or emotional condition. 6 7 "Psychotropic medication" means only those agents approved 8 by the United States Food and Drug Administration for the treatment of mental or emotional disorders. 9 This section shall [not] apply to [QUEST] all Hawaii 10 11 medicaid medical plans. 12 SECTION 3. The department of human services shall report 13 to the legislature no later than twenty days before the convening of the regular session of [2007.] 2008. The report 14 shall include: 15 16 The number of prescriptions written pursuant to this (1)17 Act; 18 (2) The cost and impact of psychiatrists or physicians 19 prescribing medications pursuant to this Act that are 20 not part of the existing formulary; and
