# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PSYCHOTROPIC MEDICATION.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. The legislature passed Act 239, Session Laws of 1 Hawaii 2005, in recognition of the importance of providing open 2 access to medications utilized to treat mental illness. 3 239, Session Laws of 2005, applied to medicaid eligible 4 individuals. The legislature finds that Act 239 has improved 5 the ability of mentally ill persons to obtain treatment for 6
- mental illness and further finds that all individuals 7
- participating in all Hawaii medicaid medical plans should have 8
- access to the same benefits. 9
- The purpose of this Act is to improve access to 10
- psychotropic medication for participants in all Hawaii medicaid 11
- 12 medical plans.
- SECTION 2. Act 239, Session Laws of Hawaii 2005, is 13
- amended by amending sections 2 and 3 to read as follows: 14
- "SECTION 2. Chapter 346, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 15
- 16 amended by adding two new sections to be appropriately
- designated and to read as follows: 17

Psychotropic medication. (a) The department 1 "§346shall not impose any restriction or limitation on the coverage 2 for, or a recipient's access to, psychotropic medication; 3 provided that the psychotropic medication shall be prescribed by 4 a licensed psychiatrist or by a [licensed] physician [in 5 consultation with a psychiatrist] duly licensed in the State. 6 As used in this section: 7 ["Consultation" means communication by telephone, 8 electronically, or face to face by a licensed psychiatrist and a 9 10 licensed physician, during which the psychiatrist concurs with the prescription made. The psychiatrist's concurring opinion 11 shall be documented in the recipient's medical record.] 12 "Psychotropic medication" means only those agents approved 13 by the United States Food and Drug Administration for the 14 treatment of mental or emotional disorders. 15 This section shall [not] apply to [QUEST] all Hawaii 16 17 medicaid medical plans. Pre-authorization exemption for psychotropic 18 medication. (a) A licensed physician may prescribe 19 psychotropic medication pursuant to the laws of this State to an 20 individual who is medicaid eligible without the requirement of 21 any preauthorization procedure otherwise required by any other 22

- 1 provision of this chapter; provided that the individual is in
- 2 need of emergency psychiatric or psychological service.
- 3 (b) As used in this section:
- 4 "Emergency psychiatric or psychological service" means
- 5 immediate administration or prescription of psychotropic
- 6 medication not to exceed seven days by a licensed physician is
- 7 required to avoid or mitigate significant adverse effects to the
- 8 individual's mental or emotional condition.
- 9 "Psychotropic medication" means only those agents approved
- 10 by the United States Food and Drug Administration for the
- 11 treatment of mental or emotional disorders.
- (c) This section shall [not] apply to [QUEST] all Hawaii
- 13 medicaid medical plans.
- 14 SECTION 3. The department of human services shall report
- 15 to the legislature no later than twenty days before the
- 16 convening of the regular session of [2007.] 2008. The report
- 17 shall include:
- 18 (1) The number of prescriptions written pursuant to this
- 19 Act;
- 20 (2) The cost and impact of psychiatrists or physicians
- 21 prescribing medications pursuant to this Act that are
- not part of the existing formulary; and

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- 1 (3) The overall utilization under chapter 346, Hawaii
- 2 Revised Statutes."
- 3 SECTION 3. Act 239, Session Laws of Hawaii 2005, is
- 4 amended by amending section 5 to read as follows:
- 5 "SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2005[7
- 6 and shall be repealed on June 30, 2007]."
- 7 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 8 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 9 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
