A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII'S MAUI COMMUNITY COLLEGE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Maui community
- 2 college (MCC) is a learning-centered institution that provides
- 3 affordable high-quality credit and non-credit educational
- 4 opportunities to a diverse community of life-long learners. MCC
- 5 offers associate in arts and associate in science degrees as
- 6 well as various certificates. It is the only community college
- 7 in the University of Hawaii (UH) system that specifically serves
- 8 the population of more than one island, as it serves both
- 9 Molokai and Lanai. It is also the sole access point to public
- 10 higher education on Lanai, Molokai, and Maui.
- MCC enrollment has increased 21.9 per cent from two
- 12 thousand three hundred thirty-seven in 1990, to two thousand
- 13 nine hundred ninety-six in 2004. MCC's strategic plan,
- 14 congruent with the UH system direction, specifically emphasizes
- 15 workforce development.
- 16 Community members at Maui's second annual community forum
- 17 and campus staff and faculty at MCC's fall 2006 convocation
- 18 listed workforce development as one of the top priorities. MCC

- 1 has identified several areas within the community, which demand
- 2 a homegrown workforce. These areas are oral health care, early
- 3 childhood education, and biotechnology.
- 4 Dental/oral health is a priority of the U.S Surgeon General
- 5 and the Hawaii health department. Hawaii is below the national
- 6 average in oral health care. Loren Pang, M.D., Maui health
- 7 officer affirms that a third of Maui county residents do not
- 8 have adequate access to dental health care. Recent department
- 9 of labor projections indicate a 3.3 per cent annual growth rate
- 10 for dental assistants for a total of eighty projected job
- 11 openings by 2010.
- 12 According to the U.S. Census Bureau there is a 9.3 per cent
- 13 (between 1999 and 2000) increase in the number of children under
- 14 five years of age in Maui county. According to the Employment
- 15 Outlook for Industries and Occupation 2000-2010, Maui County
- 16 projects a 33.3 per cent growth in jobs for pre-school and
- 17 kindergarten teachers.
- 18 Biotechnology in Hawaii is still in its infancy, however,
- 19 with the advent of new molecular biology techniques like gene
- 20 sequencing coupled with the latest computer technology, there
- 21 are expanding opportunities for applications and additional
- 22 applied research. The field of biotechnology is wide-ranging.
