A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION'S ENGINEERING SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to establish a civil engineering scholarship program, to be administered by the 2 department of transportation, to appropriate moneys to promote 3 the civil engineering profession and to offer financial 4 5 assistance, on-the-job training, and employment opportunities to 6 qualified students in Hawaii. SECTION 2. Chapter 26, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended 7 by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to 8 9 read as follows: 10 "§26- Department of transportation; civil engineering scholarship program. (a) The department of transportation 11 12 shall establish a civil engineering scholarship program open to 13 high school graduates of accredited high schools in Hawaii, or 14 high school graduates who are residents of Hawaii, who have successfully completed a high school pre-college curriculum. 15 The department of transportation shall establish, without regard

1 program that shall include but not be limited to the 2 qualification requirements, conditions for awarding a 3 scholarship, reimbursement provisions, and alternate options 4 under which a scholarship participant may participate in order 5 to otherwise fulfill an employment obligation under a 6 scholarship agreement, if the participant is not hired by the 7 department of transportation. 8 (b) The amount of the tuition component of a civil engineering scholarship award shall be limited to the resident 9 10 tuition cost of the University of Hawaii at Manoa. 11 (c) Students awarded scholarships shall agree by contract, 12 with the written approval of a parent or quardian when the 13 applicant is under eighteen years of age, to apply for full-time 14 civil service employment with the department of transportation 15 immediately after graduation from an accredited civil 16 engineering program at the University of Hawaii and, if hired, complete one year of full-time employment with the department of 17 18 transportation for each school year in the scholarship program. 19 A participant who fails to: 20 (1) Graduate from an accredited civil engineering program

1	(2) Apply for employment with the department of
2	transportation immediately upon graduation as provided
3	in this subsection, except as provided in subsection

5	shall reimburse the department of transportation the full amount
6	of moneys received.
7	(d) A participant who leaves the department of
8	transportation before completing the required number of years of
9	employment shall reimburse the department of transportation the
10	full amount of scholarship moneys received by the participant
11	for each year a scholarship is received corresponding to each
12	year for which the participant fails to complete the employment
13	requirement.
14	(e) Summer employment may be offered by the department of
15	transportation to scholarship students. The department of
16	transportation shall establish guidelines to carry out this
17	subsection.
18	(f) The department of transportation's guidelines for this
19	program shall address situations where participants may wish to
20	postpone their work commitment to pursue a masters degree in
21	civil engineering."

1	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the special fund
2	of the general administration of the department of
3	transportation (TEN 995) the sum of \$100,000, or so much thereof
4	as may be necessary for fiscal year 2006-2007, to implement the
5	department of transportation's engineering scholarship program.
6	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
7	transportation, highways division, for the purposes of this Act.
8	SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
9	SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval,
10	except that section 3 shall take effect on July 1, 2006.

DOT; Engineering Scholarship Fund

Description:

Requires DOT to establish an engineering scholarship program for qualified students in Hawaii. Requires a scholarship recipient to graduate and work for DOT the same number of years as the recipient received a scholarship. Appropriates \$100,000 from the special fund of the general administration of the DOT.
