A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO GENETICALLY MODIFIED ORGANISMS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Growth in genetically engineered agricultural
- 2 production has been swift and pervasive throughout the nation.
- 3 The guick acceptance of the new technology, however, may pose
- 4 serious consequences for the health and safety of our citizens.
- 5 Further, because of an exchange of genetic material between
- 6 genetically modified crops and conventional crops, wild plants,
- 7 and organisms is known to occur, genetically modified material
- 8 and any adverse characteristics it confers or promotes could be
- 9 irreversibly dispersed into the wider environment.
- In Hawaii, the coffee and taro-growing industry are both
- 11 widely known around the world and deeply imbedded in our
- 12 culture. The legislature finds that commercially experimenting
- 13 with the genetic engineering of these two crops without
- 14 examining and evaluating the adverse effects of this process is
- 15 careless and may have far-reaching, irreversible, and unintended
- 16 consequences.

H.B. NO. 3219

1 The purpose of this Act is to create a ten-year moratorium on testing, propagating, cultivating, raising, and growing of 2 3 genetically modified coffee and taro. SECTION 2. Chapter 321, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 4 5 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to read as follows: 6 "§321- Genetically modified organisms; moratorium; 7 coffee and taro. No genetically modified coffee or taro shall 8 9 be tested, propagated, cultivated, raised, or grown in the 10 State. 11 As used in this Act: 12 "Genetically modified" means alterations to a life form or 13 its living progeny at the nucleic acid level, using the 14 techniques collectively referred to as recombinant DNA 15 technology. "Recombinant DNA technology" means the transfer of genes, **16** 17 regulatory sequences, or nucleic acid between hosts by the use of vectors or laboratory manipulations and include the 18 insertion, excision, duplication, inactivation, or relocation of 19 specific genes, regulatory sequences, or sections of nucleic 20 acid. This term does not apply to material or an organism

- developed exclusively through traditional methods of breeding, 1
- hybridization, or nondirected mutagenesis." 2
- SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored. 3
- SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2006 and 4
- be repealed on June 30, 2016. 5
