A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MIXED MARTIAL ARTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 440, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and 3 to read as follows: 4 "PART . MIXED MARTIAL ARTS CONTESTS AND EXHIBITIONS §440-A Conduct of contests and exhibitions; applicability 5 6 of provisions. (a) All contests and exhibitions of mixed 7 martial arts shall be conducted under the supervision and 8 authority of the commission. 9 Except as otherwise provided by specific statute or 10 rule, the provisions of this chapter, including section 440-11 11 shall apply to a contest or exhibition of mixed martial arts. 12 "§440-B No rules combat, extreme or ultimate fighting, 13 or similar contests prohibited. (a) No person shall hold, 14 promote, or participate as a contestant in no rules combat, 15 extreme or ultimate fighting, or similar contests. As used in 16 this section, "no rules combat, extreme or ultimate fighting, or similar contest" means a match or exhibition performed in this 17

State, in which the contestants:

1	(1)	Are permitted to use a combination of combative
2		contact techniques, including punches, kicks, chokes,
3		joint locks, and other maneuvers, with or without the
4		use of weapons, that place contestants at an
5		unreasonably high risk of bodily injury or death; and
6	(2)	Have received, directly or indirectly, any money,
7		prize, reward, purse, or other compensation, or
8		promise thereof, for the expenses of training, for
9		taking part in the contest, or for winning the
10		contest.

 14 person who violates this section shall be subject to a fine of

 17 shall be levied and collected by the department.
- 18 (c) The department may bring an action in any court of
 19 this State to enjoin a person from continuing any violation of
 20 this section or doing any acts in furtherance thereof, and for
 21 any other relief that the court deems appropriate.

- 9 professional boxing or mixed martial arts contest in this State

- 14 moneys paid to a contestant for services, as money prize,

- 18 promoter may advance sums of money for training purposes."
