# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO INTOXICATING LIQUOR.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that underage drinking is
2	a continuing problem in Hawaii. The number of arrests by police
3	for persons under the age of twenty-one for driving under the
4	influence and zero tolerance has increased over the years. The
5	Hawaii department of health 2003 student survey concluded that
6	there has been a decrease in youth alcohol consumption in grades
7	six, eight, ten, and twelve. Those in grades ten and twelve
8	showed less of a decrease than those in the sixth and eighth
9	grades. The report concluded that those surveyed in the tenth
10	and twelfth grades showed a 59.1 and 72.5 per cent lifetime use
11	rate in 2003. The majority of tenth and twelfth graders have
12	tried alcohol in their lifetime and nearly half of the seniors
13	have reported being drunk. In a monthly trend, of those having
14	a drink in the past thirty days, the report showed that twenty-
15	seven per cent of tenth graders and thirty-six per cent of
16	twelfth graders had consumed alcohol. The consumption of
17	alcohol among the young becomes a health problem because it
18	affects the development of the brain at that young age. This

- effect alters the learning process in a way that may lead to 1 behavioral problems. To protect the young, thirty-seven states 2 have enacted laws that prohibit the consumption of alcohol by 3 anyone under the age of twenty-one. 4 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to prohibit the 5 consumption of intoxicating liquor by anyone under the age of 6 twenty-one years. 7 SECTION 2. Section 281-101.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 8 amended to read as follows: 9 "§281-101.5 Prohibitions involving minors; penalty. 10 No adult shall provide or purchase liquor for consumption or use 11 by a person under twenty-one years of age. 12 No minor shall consume or purchase liquor and no minor 13 shall have liquor in the minor's possession or custody in any 14 motor vehicle on a public highway or in any public place, public 15 gathering, or public amusement or at any public beach or public 16 park; provided that notwithstanding any other law to the 17 contrary, this subsection shall not apply to: 18
- 19 (1) Possession or custody of liquor by a minor in the
  20 course of delivery, pursuant to the direction of the
  21 minor's employer lawfully engaged in business

1	(2)	Possession [ <del>or</del> ], custody, or consumption of liquor by
2		a minor in connection with the minor's authorized
3		participation in religious ceremonies requiring [the]

5	(3)	Any person between the ages of eighteen and twenty,
6		who is participating in a controlled purchase as part
7		of a law enforcement activity or a study authorized by
8		the department of health to determine the level of
9		incidence of liquor sales to minors.
10	(c)	No minor shall falsify any identification or use any
11	false ide	ntification or identification of another person or of a
12	fictitiou	s person for the purpose of buying or attempting to buy
13	liquor or	for the purpose of obtaining employment to sell or
14	serve liq	uor on licensed premises.
15	(d)	Any person under age eighteen who violates this
16	section s	hall be subject to the jurisdiction of the family
17	court. A	ny person age eighteen or older who violates subsection
18	(a) shall	be guilty of a misdemeanor. Any person age eighteen
19	to twenty	-one who violates [subsections] subsection (b) or (c)

(e) As used in this section, "consume" or "consumption"

shall be guilty of a petty misdemeanor.

- 1 SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 2 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 3 begun, before its effective date.
- 4 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 5 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 6 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

### Report Title:

Intoxicating Liquor; Minors

## Description:

Prohibits consumption of liquor by minors. (HB3242 CD1)
