## A BILL FOR AN ACT

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 708, part IV, Hawaii Revised Statutes, 2 is amended by adding a new section to be appropriately 3 designated and to read as follows: 4 Unauthorized possession of mail. (a) A person 5 commits the offense of unauthorized possession of mail if the 6 person obtains, or exerts control over, the mail of another with 7 intent to use the mail to commit the offense of identity theft 8 under this chapter. 9 (b) Unauthorized possession of mail is a class C felony." 10 SECTION 2. Chapter 708, part X, Hawaii Revised Statutes, 11 is amended by adding a new section to be appropriately 12 designated and to read as follows: 13 Unsolicited credit card offers prohibited. (a) "§708− 14 A credit card issuer shall not mail to any person in this State 15 an unsolicited offer to issue a credit card. 16 (b) Mailing unsolicited credit card offers under
