A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SUPERSEDEAS BONDS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 607, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	"§607- Limit on supersedeas bond. (a) In any civil
5	action brought under any legal theory, the amount of a
6	supersedeas bond or other form of security necessary to stay
7	execution of a judgment granting legal, equitable, or any other
8 .	form of relief during the entire course of all appeals or
9	discretionary review of that judgment by all appellate courts
10	shall be set in accordance with applicable law, except that the
11	total amount of such supersedeas bond or other form of security
12	that is required of any party may not exceed \$25,000,000,
13	regardless of the amount or other provision of the judgment that
14	is appealed.
15	(b) If the party posting the supersedeas bond is a small
16	business concern as defined by section 210-1, the supersedeas
17	bond required under subsection (b) may not exceed \$1,000,000.
