HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

ESTABLISHING A TASK FORCE TO STUDY AND RECOMMEND ACTIONS TO PREVENT THE SPREAD OF COQUI FROGS AND OTHER INVASIVE SPECIES.

WHEREAS, the State must control the spread of coqui frogs and other invasive species; and

WHEREAS, the State will lose the battle if aggressive management action is not taken; and

WHEREAS, near-term solutions are needed to fight the spread of coqui frogs and other invasive species; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-third Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2006, the Senate concurring, that a task force be established to evaluate and recommend actions to prevent the spread of coquifrogs and other invasive species; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force be established under the Hawaii Invasive Species Council (HISC) and consist of eight members as follows:

- (1) The Chairperson of HISC, or the Chairperson's designee, who will serve as the chair of the task force;
- (2) The Chairperson of the state Board of Agriculture, or the Chairperson's designee;
- (3) The Secretary of the U.S. Department of Agriculture, or the Secretary's designee;
- (4) The Dean of the University of Hawaii College of Tropical Agriculture and Human Resources, or the Dean's designee;
