1 (7) Transaction costs are minimized. 2 The purpose of this Act is to require all branches, 3 departments, and agencies of state government to transition to 4 the automated clearinghouse system as the primary electronic 5 funds transfer system used by the State. In addition, this Act 6 requires all branches, departments, agencies, state employees, 7 retirees and beneficiaries to establish direct deposit for 8 salary, retirement, medical, reimbursement and per diem 9 payments. 10 SECTION 2. Chapter 36, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended 11 by adding a new section to part I to be appropriately designated 12 and to read as follows: 13 "§36- Automated clearinghouse system. (a) No later 14 than July 1, 2007, the State shall implement the automated 15 clearinghouse system as the primary electronic funds transfer 16 system for all state transactions, including but not limited to: 17 (1) All salary, retirement, medical, employee 18 reimbursements and per diem payments; and 19 (2) All payments to private contractors doing financial 20 business with the State. 21 To facilitate the automated clearinghouse processing of all state transactions, the State shall establish direct deposit for 22
