RELATING TO CRIMINAL OFFENSES BY MINORS.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 709, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated		
3	and to read as follows:		
4	"§709- Tobacco use by a minor; penalties. (1) A person		
5	commits the offense of tobacco use by a minor if the person is a		
6	minor under eighteen years of age and uses any tobacco product,		
7	including but not limited to tobacco cigarettes, chewing		
8	tobacco, and snuff.		
9	(2) A person who violates this section shall be sentenced		
10	to any one or more of the following:		
11	(a) A maximum fine of \$500;		
12	(b) A maximum of fifty hours of community service during		
13	hours when the person is not employed and is not		
14	attending school; and		
15	(c) A maximum of ten hours of substance abuse counseling."		
16	SECTION 2. Chapter 710, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
17	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated		
18	and to read as follows:

3	<u>(d)</u>	Suspension of the person's license and privilege to

5	(4)	Any person under the age of eighteen who violates this
6	section s	hall be sentenced to any one or more of the following:
7	<u>(a)</u>	A maximum fine of \$2,000;
8	<u>(b)</u>	A maximum of one hundred hours of community service
9		during hours when the person is not employed and is
10		not attending school;
11	<u>(c)</u>	A maximum of ten hours of substance abuse counseling;
