### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO INDEPENDENT EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read 2 3 as follows: 4 "CHAPTER 5 PRIVATE TRADE, VOCATIONAL, OR TECHNICAL SCHOOLS AND DEGREE GRANTING INSTITUTIONS -1 Definitions. As used in this chapter, the 7 following terms have the following meanings unless the context 8 indicates otherwise: 9 10 "Degree" means "degree" as defined in section 446E-1. 11 "Degree granting institution" means "degree granting institution" as defined in section 446E-1, provided that the 12 13 term shall not include any institution established under the University of Hawaii system. 14 15 "Department" means the department of commerce and consumer affairs. 16 "Director" means the director of commerce and consumer 17

"Private trade, vocational, or technical school" means any 1 plan or method used by any person or persons, firm, or any other 2 organization or corporation for giving instruction in any form 3 or manner in any trade, occupation, or vocation for a 4 consideration, reward, or promise of whatever nature, including 5 correspondence schools located within the State. The term does 6 not include "public schools" defined in section 302A-101. 7 -2 Regulation of private trade, vocational, or 8 Ş technical schools and degree granting institutions. The 9 10 department shall regulate private trade, vocational, or technical schools and degree granting institutions. 11 License required for private trade, vocational, or 12 S technical school and degree granting institution. (a) 13 14 private trade, vocational, or technical school shall be operated by any person or persons, firm, or any other private 15 16 organization or corporation for the purpose of teaching any trade, occupation, or vocation or any program or course leading 17 18 to a degree unless there is first secured from the department a license issued in accordance with this chapter and in such form 19 as the department may direct. The purpose of the licensing and 20 regulation is to protect consumers against practices by private 21

- 3 (b) The department shall charge fees for each initial
- 4 license and every renewal of that license. The department shall

- 8 may suspend or revoke a license at any time when, in the
- 9 judgment of the department, the licensee is not complying with

- 12 licensee by registered or certified mail with return receipt at
- 13 the licensee's last known address.

An officer or employee of the State who does not have 13 tenure and who may be transferred or appointed to a civil 14 15 service position as a consequence of this Act shall become a civil service employee without the loss of salary, seniority, **16** prior service credit, vacation, sick leave, or other employee 17 benefits or privileges and without the necessity of examination; 18 19 provided that such officer or employee possesses the minimum

qualifications for the position to which transferred or

appointed.

If an office or position held by an officer or employee 1 2 having tenure is abolished, the officer or employee shall not thereby be separated from public employment, but shall remain in 3 the employment of the State with the same pay and classification 4 and shall be transferred to some other office or position for 5 which the officer or employee is eligible under the personnel 6 laws of the State as determined by the head of the department or 7 8 the governor. SECTION 9. All appropriations, records, equipment, 9 10 machines, files, supplies, contracts, books, papers, documents, maps, and other personal property heretofore made, used, 11 acquired, or held by the department of education relating to the 12 functions transferred to the department of commerce and consumer 13 14 affairs shall be transferred with the functions to which they 15 relate. SECTION 10. All rules, policies, procedures, quidelines, 16 and other material adopted or developed by the department of 17 18 education to implement provisions of the Hawaii Revised Statutes which are reenacted or made applicable to the department of 19 commerce and consumer affairs by this Act, shall remain in full 20 force and effect until amended or repealed by the department of 21 22 commerce and consumer affairs pursuant to chapter 91, Hawaii

- 1 Revised Statutes. In the interim, every reference to the
- 2 department of education or superintendent of education in those
- 3 rules, policies, procedures, guidelines, and other material is
- 4 amended to refer to the department of commerce and consumer
- 5 affairs or the director of commerce and consumer affairs as
- 6 appropriate.
- 7 SECTION 11. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 8 and stricken.
- 9 SECTION 12. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2006.
