A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CHILDREN.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 291C, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	"S291C- Leaving a child unsupervised in a motor vehicle.
5	(a) Notwithstanding chapter 571 or any other law to the
6	contrary, a person commits the offense of leaving a child
7	unsupervised in a motor vehicle if the person, whether or not
8	charged with the care or custody of a child, leaves a child
9	unsupervised in a motor vehicle.
10	(b) Any law enforcement officer, firefighter, or rescue
11	team personnel who observes a child left unsupervised in a motor
12	vehicle and determines that the unsupervised child is in
13	physical danger, or poses a danger to others, may use whatever
14	means are reasonably necessary to protect the child or others
15	and remove the child from the motor vehicle.
16	(c) If the person who left the unsupervised child in the
17	motor vehicle cannot be located within a reasonable time, the
18	law enforcement officer, firefighter, or rescue team personnel,

    written notification of the child's removal to the motor vehicle
