A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE ENVIRONMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

Environmental justice is generally understood 1 SECTION 1. 2 to require the fair treatment and meaningful involvement of all 3 people regardless of race, color, national origin, or income with respect to the development, implementation, and enforcement 4 of environmental laws, regulations, and policies. In 1994, 5 President Clinton signed Executive Order 12,898 (order) to focus 6 federal attention on the environmental and human health 7 conditions of minority and low-income populations, with the goal 8 of achieving environmental protection for all communities. The 9 order directed federal agencies to develop environmental justice 10 strategies to help federal agencies address the 11 12 disproportionately high and adverse human health or environmental effects of their programs on minority and 13 14 low-income populations. The order was intended to provide minority and low-income communities with access to public 15 16 information and with meaningful public participation in matters

relating to human health and the environment.

In 2005, the legislature adopted Senate Concurrent 1 Resolution No. 140, H.D. 1, in recognition of the environmental 2 3 justice concerns that may arise from impacts on the natural and physical environment, such as human health or ecological impacts 4 on minority populations, low-income populations, and native 5 Hawaiians, or from related social or economic impacts. The 6 7 environmental council drafted a plan to accomplish the tasks 8 requested by the legislature. The legislature finds that there is a need to conduct a 9 comprehensive and scholarly review of the state environmental 10 11 impact statement process to evaluate its continued efficacy, the effectiveness of the amendments made by Act 50, Session Laws of 12 Hawaii 2000, and the possible need to revise chapter 343, Hawaii 13 Revised Statutes. The review should include a determination of 14 whether the environmental impact statement process includes 15 appropriate consideration of the effects of a proposed action on 16 the cultural practices of the State and community, as required 17 by section 343-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes. 18 The legislature further finds that there is a need to 19 develop an environmental justice guidance document to ensure 20 that principles of environmental justice are systematically 21 included in all phases of the environmental review process, and 22

- 1 that each agency fulfills its duty to identify and address at
- 2 the earliest possible time any disproportionately adverse human
- 3 health, environmental, or cultural effects on minority
- 4 populations, native Hawaiians, and low-income populations that
- 5 would be caused by a proposed action or the agency's policies,
- 6 programs, and activities.
- 7 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 8 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$, or so
- 9 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2006-2007, for
- 10 the environmental council to hire a program director to
- 11 facilitate and coordinate the State's environmental justice
- 12 activities and for related administrative and operational costs.
- 13 The environmental justice activities shall include, but not be
- 14 limited to:
- 15 (1) Defining "environmental justice" in the unique context
- of this State through educational community outreach
- 17 activities;
- 18 (2) Developing and adopting a guidance document that
- 19 addresses environmental justice in all phases of the
- 20 environmental impact statement process;

1	(3)	Making recommendations to appeare the environmentar
2		impact statement process in chapter 343, Hawaii
3		Revised Statutes; and
4	(4)	Conducting educational and community outreach
5		activities.
6	SECT	ION 3. The sum appropriated shall be expended by the
7	departmen	t of health for the purposes of this Act.
8	SECT	ION 4. Notwithstanding chapter 103D, Hawaii Revised
9	Statutes,	the office of environmental quality control shall
10	contract	with the University of Hawaii environmental center to
11	conduct a	comprehensive review of the State's existing
12	environme	ntal impact statement process under chapter 343, Hawaii
13	Revised S	tatutes. The comprehensive review shall include:
14	(1)	A review of all guidance documents for implementing
15		chapter 343;
16	(2)	An evaluation of the amendments made in Act 50,
17		Session Laws of Hawaii 2000, to determine if
18		environmental impact statements give appropriate
19		consideration to the effects of a proposed action on
20		the cultural practices of the State and community; and
21	(3)	The conclusions, findings, and recommendations of the
22		comprehensive review.

- 1 The University of Hawaii environmental center shall submit the
- 2 comprehensive review to the legislature no later than twenty
- 3 days prior to the convening of the regular session of 2007.
- 4 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general
- 5 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$, or so
- 6 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2006-2007, for
- 7 the University of Hawaii environmental center to perform a
- 8 comprehensive review of the State's current environmental impact
- 9 statement process under chapter 343, Hawaii Revised Statutes
- 10 pursuant to section 4 of this Act.
- 11 SECTION 6. The sum appropriated shall be expended by the
- 12 department of health for the purposes of this Act.
- SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2006.
