A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HOUSING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. According to the most recent census data,
- 2 grandparents and other relatives are raising more than six
- 3 million children in the United States. The United States Census
- 4 Bureau reports that more than two million grandparents are
- 5 raising 4.5 million children in the United States, and other
- 6 relatives are raising an additional 1.5 million children. In
- 7 Hawaii, more than fourteen thousand grandparents are the primary
- 8 caregivers for their grandchildren.
- 9 Families in Hawaii headed by grandparents and other elderly
- 10 relatives who need assistance with affordable housing are faced
- 11 with age restrictions on residents living in elder housing
- 12 facilities.
- 13 The purpose of this Act is to extend eliqibility for elder
- 14 or elderly housing to a member of an elder household who is the
- 15 primary caregiver for a minor child to whom the caregiver is
- 16 related by blood or marriage.

- 6 SECTION 4. If any part of this Act is found to be in
- 7 conflict with federal requirements that are a prescribed
- 8 condition for the allocation of federal funds to the State, the
- 9 conflicting part of this Act is inoperative solely to the extent
- 10 of the conflict and with respect to the agencies directly
- 11 affected, and this finding does not affect the operation of the
- 12 remainder of this Act in its application to the agencies
- 13 concerned. The rules under this Act shall meet federal
- 14 requirements that are a necessary condition to the receipt of
- 15 federal funds by the State.
- 16 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 17 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 18 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2006.

Description:

Adds definition of "relative caregiver" and amends the definition of "elder or elderly households" to include minor children for whom a grandparent or other relative is the primary caretaker. Amends the definition of "elder" or "elderly" to be a person who is age fifty-five or older. (SD1)
