## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FOSTER CHILDREN.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. Chapter 587, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended 1 by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to 2 read as follows: 3 4 Foster children's bill of rights. Not withstanding any provision to the contrary, the department has 5 6 the duty as foster custodian or permanent custodian to ensure 7 that children living under its care have the following rights 8 protected and enforced: 9 (1) To be treated with fairness, dignity, respect, and 10 without discrimination because of race, color, 11 religion, disability, sexual orientation, national 12 origin, age, and gender; 13 To be free from harassment, corporal punishment, (2) unreasonable restraint, and physical, sexual, verbal,

- To live in a safe, healthy, and comfortable home; 16 (3)

4		reasonably accommodated.
5	(10)	To receive an appropriate education consistent with
6		the laws of this State, including the right to have
7		the opportunity to participate in extracurricular,
8		cultural, and personal enrichment activities that are
9		reasonably available, accommodated, and consistent
10		with the child's age and developmental level;
11	(11)	(A) To work and develop job skills at an age-
12		appropriate level, consistent with the laws of
13		this State and as may be reasonably accommodated;
14		and
15		(B) To receive appropriate life skills training to
16		prepare for independent living;
17	(12)	To attend court hearings relating to the child's case
18		and to have the opportunity to be heard;
19	(13)	To have confidentiality maintained consistent with the
20		laws of this State;
21	(14)	To have any kinship resource or previous foster parent
22		of the child be considered as the preferred placement

1	resource if such placement is consistent with the best
2	interest of the child and the needs of other children
3	in the kinship residence or foster parent's home;
4	(15) To be permitted to exercise parental and decision-
5	making authority over his or her own child and to
6	reside with his or her own child if the foster child
7	has a child of his or her own, if appropriate and as
8	may be reasonably accommodated, unless prohibited by
9	order of court; and
10	(16) (A) To have the opportunity to contact the department
11	confidentially and to make complaints regarding
12	alleged violations of the child's rights; and
13	(B) To be free from harassment and retaliation
14	regarding such actions."
15	SECTION 2. New statutory material is underscored.
16	SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
