A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The employees' retirement system of the State 1 of Hawaii is intended to be a tax-qualified retirement plan 2 under section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as 3 amended (Code). Section 414(h)(2) of the Code provides for 4 favorable tax treatment for employee contributions "picked up" 5 (made by the employer on behalf of the employee) to a tax-6 qualified retirement plan established by a state or county or by 7 an agency or instrumentality of a state or county. However, the 8 9 tax-qualified status of a government retirement plan may be jeopardized if: the plan allows members to receive a refund of 10 the contributions made under section 414(h)(2) of the Code, 11 while the member is employed by the government; or a member who 12 13 received a refund of contributions, made under section 414(h)(2) of the Code, while the member was still employed by the 14 government is allowed to have additional contributions made on 15 behalf of the member under section 414(h)(2). The purpose of 16 this Act is to repeal the portions of chapter 88, Hawaii Revised 17 18 Statutes, that: allow members of the employees' retirement SB2274 SD1 LRB 06-2631-1.doc

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system to receive a refund of contributions, made under section
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    414(h)(2) of the Code, while the member is still employed by the
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    State or a county; or allow members of the employees' retirement
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    system who received a refund of contributions, made under
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    section 414(h)(2) of the Code, while still employed by the State
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    or a county to have additional contributions made on behalf of
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    the member under section 414(h)(2).
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         SECTION 2. Section 88-271, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
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    amended by amending subsections (d) and (e) to read as follows:
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         "(d) [Any class A or class H member who elects and is
    approved to withdraw the member's contributions may become a
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    class C member in accordance with section 88-46.5. Upon
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    approval of the election:
         (1) All rights as a class A or class H member shall be
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              extinguished;
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         (2) The member's accumulated contributions shall be
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              refunded; and
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         (3) The member shall not be required to make further
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              contributions to the system.
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This election shall be irrevocable. The election by any class A

or class B member to become a class C member pursuant to section

88-46.5 in the form in which it existed at any time prior to

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July 1, 2006, shall be irrevocable upon refund of the member's
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    accumulated contributions.
          (e) The system shall provide information explaining the
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    effects of any election made under subsection (a) [\tau] or (c) [\tau]

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         SECTION 3. Section 88-321, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
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    amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows:

13	of this chapter to the contrary, a member who is in a position
14	covered by Title II of the Social Security Act may apply to the
15	system for a one-time withdrawal of the member's contributions
16	in the event of economic hardship.
17	(b) Upon approval of the member's election, all rights as
18	a class A or class H member shall be extinguished and the member
19	shall:
20	(1) Become a class C member;
21	(2) Be refunded the member's contributions; and

1	(c)	The system shall administer this section and shall:
2	(1)	Prescribe the verification needed for the withdrawal
3		election authorized under this section;
4	(2)	Provide the member with information explaining the
5		effects of the election;
6	(3)	Review the facts and make a case-by-case
7		determination; and
8	-(4)	Notify the member in writing of the approval of the
9		withdrawal or the disapproval and the reasons for the
10		disapproval.
11	(d) -	For the purposes of this section, "economic hardship"
12	means a f	inancial hardship resulting from any of the following
13	condition	s that cannot be satisfied by other resources,
14	including	:
15	(1)	A sudden and unexpected illness or accident of the
16		member or the member's dependent;
17	(2)	The loss of the member's property due to a casualty;
18		or
19	(3)	Any other extraordinary and unforeseeable circumstance
20		arising as a result of events beyond the member's
21		control."]

- 4 except that sections 2 and 3 shall take effect retroactive to
- 5 July 1, 2004.
