# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PROTECTION OF FOREST RESERVES.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

#### PART I

1	SECT	ION 1. Chapter 183, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is			
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated				
3	and to read as follows:				
4	"§18	3- General administrative penalties. (a) Except as			
5	otherwise	provided by law, the board or its authorized			
6	representative may:				
7	(1)	Set, charge, and collect administrative fines;			
8	(2)	Bring legal action to recover administrative fines,			
9		fees, and costs, including attorney's fees and costs			
10		and costs associated with land or habitat restoration;			
11		and			
12	(3)	Collect administrative fees and costs pursuant to			
13		paragraph (2),			
14	resulting	from a violation of this chapter, any rule adopted, or			
15	permit is	sued thereunder.			
16	(b)	The administrative fines for violation of this chapter			
17	shall be	as follows:

1	(1)	For a first violation, or any violation not preceded
2		within a five-year period by a violation of this
3		chapter, a fine of not more than \$2,500 per violation;
4	(2)	For a second violation within five years of a previous
5		violation of this chapter, a fine of not more than
6		\$5,000 per violation; and
7	(3)	For a third or subsequent violation within five years
8		of the last violation of this chapter, a fine of not
9		more than \$10,000 per violation.
10	(c)	In addition:
11	(1)	A fine of up to \$10,000 per violation of section
12		183-17 may be levied for each destroyed or harvested
13		koa tree, or portion thereof, larger than six inches
14		in diameter at ground level; and

1	(e) No person shall be sanctioned pursuant to this section
2	for the exercise of native Hawaiian gathering rights and
3	traditional cultural practices as authorized by law or as
4	permitted by the department pursuant to Article XII, Section 7
5	of the Hawaii State Constitution.
6	(f) The department shall submit an annual report outlining
7	the revenues generated by the penalties to the legislature at
8	least twenty days before the convening of each regular session."
9	SECTION 2. Section 183-18, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
10	amended to read as follows:
11	"§183-18 [Penalty.] Criminal penalties. Any person who
12	violates section 183-17, upon conviction thereof, is guilty of a
13	misdemeanor and shall be fined not more than $[\$1,000]$ $\$2,000$ or
14	imprisoned not more than one year, or both. <u>In addition to any</u>
15	other penalty imposed under this section, a fine of up to \$2,000
16	shall be levied for each tree illegally destroyed or harvested
17	under section 183-17."

requires that income from the harvest and sale of certain forest

products and tree seedlings of the forest reserves be deposited

### Report Title:

Conservation; Forests

#### Description:

Establishes general administrative penalties for violations of the forest reserves law. Increases criminal fines for timber trespass. Allows all revenue derived from forest reserves, including fines or penalties for violations, to be deposited into the Forest Stewardship Fund for management of the State Forest Reserve System. (CD1)
