## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO GROUNDED VESSELS.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 200, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding to part III a new section to be designated and
3	to read as follows:
4	" <u>\$200-47.5</u> Vessel aground on state property. (a) All
5	vessels grounded on state submerged lands, shorelines, or coral
6	reefs shall be removed immediately by the owner or operator and
7	at the owner's expense. Vessels grounded on a sand beach,
8	sandbar, or mudflat and not in imminent danger of breaking up
9	shall be removed within seventy-two hours, unless otherwise
10	agreed to by the department. Damage to state or private
11	property caused by the grounded vessels shall be the sole
12	responsibility of the vessel's owner.
13	(b) Solely for the purposes of removal and with no
14	liability to the department, the department may assume control
15	of any vessel that:
16	(1) Is grounded on a coral reef or in imminent danger of
17	breaking up; and

T	(2) Carnot be indicately removed by the owner in a manner
2	that is reasonably safe, as determined by the
3	department.
4	Once the department assumes control over the vessel, the vessel
5	shall be directed to a safer location. All costs and expenses
6	of the vessel removal and damages to state or private property
7	shall be the sole responsibility of the vessel's owner. This
8	section shall apply whether the vessel is attended or deemed
9	derelict under section 200-48.
10	(c) The department may take legal action to collect any
11	costs or expenses incurred by the department for any removal
12	under this section. All moneys collected shall be deposited in
13	the boating special fund.
14	(d) Any person who renders assistance in compliance with
15	subsection (b) and any person who in good faith without
16	remuneration or expectation of remuneration renders assistance
17	at the scene of a vessel grounded on a coral reef or in imminent
18	danger of breaking up shall not be liable for any civil damages
19	resulting from the person's acts or omissions in providing or
20	arranging towage or other assistance, except for damages caused
21	by the person's gross negligence or wanton acts or omissions."
