## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ELECTION.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

| 1  | SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii's statutes          |
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| 2  | specify that a person's voting rights are only lost upon         |
| 3  | incarceration for a felony offense. The legislature further      |
| 4  | finds that Hawaii's statutes directing the courts to report      |
| 5  | felony convictions to election officials do not always contain   |
| 6  | the necessary sentencing information because sentencing may      |
| 7  | occur much later after a conviction.                             |
| 8  | The purpose of this Act is to amend state law to direct the      |
| 9  | judiciary and paroling authority to report felony convictions at |
| 10 | the time of actual sentencing of the individual.                 |
| 11 | SECTION 2. Chapter 353, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is              |
| 12 | amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated   |
| 13 | and to read as follows:  |

| 15 | authority grants or revokes parole for any citizen of eighteen   |
| 16 | years of age or over, the paroling authority, in each case,      |
| 17 | shall make and promptly transmit to the clerk of the respective  |
| 18 | county in which the person resides, a certificate showing the    |

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fact of the granting or revoking of parole within twenty days
