A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE MAKENA-KEONEOIO GOVERNMENT ROAD.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the Ahihi-Kinau area
- 2 on Maui's southwest flank that contains the most recent lava
- 3 flow from Haleakala, was the first designated natural area
- 4 reserve in the State, in June 1973. The reserve contains
- 5 numerous ancient Hawaiian archaeological and cultural sites;
- 6 fragile anchialine ponds, containing endangered endemic aquatic
- 7 species; and isolated coves, small bays, and coral reefs,
- 8 containing numerous species of marine fauna, including fish,
- 9 crustaceans, corals, and aquatic vegetation.
- 10 The Makena-Keoneoio government road that traverses the
- 11 reserve permits uncontrolled public access to the reserve.
- 12 Further, publicity of the reserve and its many resources in
- 13 travel books and journals is attracting hundreds of visitors
- 14 from all over the world every day to the reserve. This influx
- 15 of visitors is having an enormous negative impact on the reserve
- 16 and its resources.
- 17 The legislature notes that the Makena-Keoneoio government
- 18 road is a county road owned by the county of Maui.



1	The purpose of this Act is to direct the county of Madi to	
2	provide limited access on the Makena-Keoneoio government road	
3	where it traverses the Ahihi-Kinau natural area reserve.	
4	SECTION 2. Chapter 195, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
5	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated	
6	and to read as follows:	
7	" <u>§</u> 19	5- Ahihi-Kinau natural area reserve; Makena-Keoneoio
8	governmen	t road. (a) The county of Maui shall prohibit public
9	access to the Makena-Keoneoio government road where it traverses	
10	the Ahihi-Kinau natural area reserve.	
11	(b) Access to the portion of the Makena-Keoneoio	
12	government road that is closed to public access shall be limited	
13	to the following:	
14	(1)	Legal residents of the area that require access to
15		their residences using the road;
16	(2)	State and county officials and employees requiring
17		access for the maintenance of the road and the
18		maintenance of the reserve and its resources; and
19	<u>(3)</u>	Persons that are permitted into the reserve pursuant
20		to administrative rules adopted by the department of
21		land and natural resources."

- 1 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
- 2 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
