A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE ELIMINATION OF STATEHOOD DAY AS A PAID STATE HOLIDAY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. There is a lack of organization, celebration, 2 or participation in any Statehood Day festivities despite the 3 fact that ninety-four percent of Hawaii voters, a clear 4 representation of all ethnic groups, affirmed statehood in 1959. 5 State officials and employees have also shown little or no 6 support for Hawaii's union with the United States. Given this demonstrated displeasure and lack of support for Hawaii as part 7 8 of the United States, the State should not recognize Statehood 9 Day as a state holiday for which it's employees are compensated. 10 SECTION 2. Section 8-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 11 amended to read as follows: "\$8-1 Holidays designated. The following days of each year 12 13 are set apart and established as state holidays: 14 The first day in January, New Year's Day; The third Monday in January, Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., 15
