
### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO JUSTIFIABLE USE OF FORCE.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 703-304, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "§703-304 Use of force in self-protection. (1)
- to the provisions of this section and of section 703-308, the 4
- 5 use of force upon or toward another person is justifiable when
- the actor believes that such force is immediately necessary for 6
- 7 the purpose of protecting himself against the use of unlawful
- 8 force by the other person on the present occasion.
- 9 The use of deadly force is justifiable under this (2)
- 10 section if the actor believes that deadly force is necessary to
- 11 protect himself against death, serious bodily injury,
- 12 kidnapping, rape, or forcible sodomy.
- 13 (3) Except as otherwise provided in subsections (4) and
- 14 (5) of this section, a person employing protective force may
- 15 estimate the necessity thereof under the circumstances as he
- 16 believes them to be when the force is used without retreating,
- 17 surrendering possession, doing any other act which he has no
- 18 legal duty to do, or abstaining from any lawful action.

| 11 | another is justifiable to protect a third person when:                                        |
