## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII RULES OF EVIDENCE.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. While it is only civil and humane to apologize
- 2 and offer sympathy or other expressions of understanding to
- 3 persons who have been harmed in some way, the reality of
- 4 lawsuits often prevents these expressions of apology or sympathy
- 5 from being made for fear that they will be used subsequently as
- 6 an admission of liability. Ironically, many people will bring a
- 7 claim or a lawsuit against another person or other entity for
- $oldsymbol{8}$  the simple reason that there has been no apology or expression
- 9 of empathy made to them. Particularly in our State, the Aloha
- 10 State, it is regrettable that members of our community cannot
- 11 reach out to others in a humane way without fear of having this
- 12 communication subsequently used as an admission of liability.
- 13 This Act will allow these expressions without fear that they
- 14 will be used against those who express these sentiment to
- 15 others.
- 16 SECTION 2. Section 626-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 17 amended by adding to article IV a new rule to be appropriately
- 18 designated and to read as follows:



1	" <u>Rul</u>	<b>apologies.</b> (a) Evidence of written or oral
2	apologies	, whether made before or during judicial or
3	administr	ative proceedings relating to the subject matter of the
4	apology,	is not admissible to prove liability. Evidence of
5	benevolen	t gestures made in connection with such apologies is
6	likewise	not admissible. A statement of fault, which is part
7	of, or in	addition to, any of the above shall not be
8	inadmissi	ble pursuant to this section.
9	(b)	For the purposes of this rule:
10	(1)	"Apology" means an expression of sympathy or
11		understanding regarding pain, suffering, or death
12		which may have resulted from the subject matter of the
13		judicial or administrative proceeding;
14	(2)	"Benevolent gestures" means actions which convey a
15		sense of compassion or commiseration emanating from
16		<pre>humane impulses."</pre>
17	SECT	ION 3. This Act does not affect the rights or duties
18	that matu	red, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that
19	were begu	n, before its effective date.
