## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PSYCHOTROPIC MEDICATION.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Act 239, Session Laws of Hawaii 2005, is 1 2 amended by amending section 2 to read as follows: "SECTION 2. Chapter 346, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 3 amended by adding [two] a new [sections] section to be 4 5 appropriately designated and to read as follows: 6 "\$3**46**-Psychotropic medication. [(a) The department 7 shall not impose any restriction or limitation on the coverage for, or a recipient's access to, psychotropic medication; 8 9 provided that the psychotropic medication shall be prescribed by 10 a licensed psychiatrist or by a licensed physician in consultation with a psychiatrist duly licensed in the State. 11 12 (b) As used in this section: "Consultation" means communication by telephone, 13 electronically, or face to face by a licensed psychiatrist and a 14 licensed physician, during which the psychiatrist concurs with 15 the prescription made. The psychiatrist's concurring opinion 16 17 shall be documented in the recipient's medical record.

19	individual who is medicaid eligible without the requirement of
20	any preauthorization procedure otherwise required by any other
21	provision of this chapter; provided that the individual is in
22	need of emergency psychiatric or psychological service.

1	(b) As used in this section:
2	"Emergency psychiatric or psychological service" means
3	immediate administration or prescription of psychotropic
4	medication not to exceed seven days by a licensed physician is
5	required to avoid or mitigate significant adverse effects to the
6	individual's mental or emotional condition.
7	"Psychotropic medication" means only those agents approved
8	by the United States Food and Drug Administration for the
9	treatment of mental or emotional disorders.
10	(c) This section shall not apply to QUEST medical

9	"SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on [July 1, 2005,
