A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TEMPORARY ASSISTANCE FOR NEEDY FAMILIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Expenditures of federal temporary assistance for needy families program funds must meet one of four specific 2 purposes. These purposes are: 3 (1)To provide assistance to needy families so that 4 children may be cared for in their own homes or in the 5 homes of relatives; (2) To end the dependence of needy parents on government 7 benefits by promoting job preparation, work, and marriage; 9 To prevent and reduce the incidence of out-of-wedlock 10 (3) pregnancies and establish numerical goals for 11 preventing and reducing the incidence of these 12 13 pregnancies; and (4) To encourage the formation and maintenance of two-14 15 parent families. Congress recently enacted the Deficit Reduction Act of 2005, 16

P.L. 109-171, effective October 1, 2006, which will require

- 1 Hawaii to meet heightened family work participation requirements
- 2 and avoid financial penalty.
- 3 The legislature finds that when access to post-secondary
- 4 education is included as part of workforce development it is an
- 5 effective means to end dependence on government benefits, thus
- 6 promoting economic self sufficiency. The legislature further
- 7 finds that the department of human services needs to include the
- 8 community and legislature in a strategic planning process to
- 9 plan for future use of temporary assistance for needy families
- 10 funds.
- 11 PART I
- 12 SECTION 2. The purpose of this part is to appropriate or
- 13 authorize moneys for work and work support programs for needy
- 14 families to promote higher skill level job preparation and
- 15 employment.
- 16 SECTION 3. There is appropriated or authorized from
- 17 temporary assistance for needy families funds the sum of
- 18 \$, or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
- 19 year 2006-2007, for services that will assist temporary
- 20 assistance for needy families recipients to prepare for, obtain,
- 21 and retain gainful employment through these programs pursuant to

- 1 this part; provided that funds shall be used only for purposes
- 2 authorized under federal guidelines.
- 3 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 4 human services for the purposes of this part.
- 5 PART II
- 6 SECTION 4. The legislature finds that many children and
- 7 youth are on their own in the mornings and afternoons before and
- 8 after the school bell rings. Nationally, nearly two-thirds of
- 9 school-age children and youth are in homes with two working
- 10 parents, but very few communities have a comprehensive system of
- 11 before- and after-school care for children and youth. Although
- 12 Hawaii has the A+ program for students in kindergarten through
- 13 grade six, older children also need adult supervision. When
- 14 older children are unsupervised in the mornings, afternoons,
- 15 evenings, on weekends, and during other non-school hours,
- 16 statistics clearly show an increase in the rates of juvenile
- 17 crime, drug use, and experimentation with tobacco, alcohol, and
- 18 sex.
- 19 Community-based programs deliver a comprehensive set of
- 20 services, including community-based outreach, case management,
- 21 positive alternative activities related to teen pregnancy
- 22 prevention, and promotion of two-parent families. These

- 1 programs provide positive experiences and opportunities for
- 2 young people and are based on a mix of required activities that
- 3 shape healthy beliefs and lifestyles and reduce risky behaviors.
- 4 The programs operate during after-school hours, weekends, and
- 5 other non-school hours, including school inter-sessions and
- 6 holidays.
- 7 The legislature further finds that there is widespread
- 8 agreement about the importance of establishing safe, structured
- 9 learning environments for children and youth during non-school
- 10 hours.
- 11 The purpose of this part is to appropriate funds for non-
- 12 school hour programs for children and youth. The programs shall
- 13 include community-based programs, summer programs, and programs
- 14 for students in grades kindergarten through twelve.
- 15 SECTION 5. There is appropriated or authorized from
- 16 temporary assistance for needy families funds the sum of
- 17 \$, or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
- 18 year 2006-2007, for programs pursuant to this part; provided
- 19 that funds shall be used only for purposes authorized under
- 20 federal guidelines.
- 21 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 22 human services for the purposes of this part.

2	SECTION 6. The purpose of this part is to appropriate or
3	authorize moneys for programs or services for child welfare.
4	SECTION 7. There is appropriated or authorized from
5	temporary assistance for needy families funds the sum of
6	\$, or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
7	year 2006-2007, and up to \$ may be transferred from
8	temporary assistance for needy families funds to the social
9	services block grant, for programs pursuant to this part;
10	provided that funds shall be used only for purposes authorized
11	under federal guidelines.
12	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
13	human services for the purposes of this part.
14	PART IV
15	SECTION 8. The legislature finds that the greatest threat
16	to caring for children in their own homes is the escalating cost
17	of housing. The purpose of this part is to appropriate or
18	authorize moneys for programs or services for eligible families
19	to assist with overcoming increasing costs of housing and to
20	address homelessness.
21	SECTION 9. There is appropriated or authorized from the
22	temporary assistance for needy families funds the sum of

, or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal 1 Š year 2006-2007, for programs pursuant to this part; provided 2 that funds shall be used only for purposes authorized under 3 federal quidelines. 4 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of 5 6 human services for the purposes of this part. PART V 7 SECTION 10. There is appropriated or authorized from the 8 9 temporary assistance for needy families funds the sum of 10 , or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2006-2007, for child care services and up to \$ may 11 be transferred to the child care development block grant, 12 pursuant to this part; provided that funds shall be used only 13 for purposes authorized under federal guidelines. 14 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of 15 human services for the purposes of this part. 16 PART VI 17 SECTION 11. There is appropriated or authorized from the 18 temporary assistance for needy families funds the sum of 19 , or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal 20 year 2006-2007, for cash assistance benefits to families for

- 4 human services for the purposes of this part.
- 5 PART VII
- 6 SECTION 12. There is appropriated or authorized from the
- 7 temporary assistance for needy families funds the sum of
- 8 \$, or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
- 9 year 2006-2007, for operating costs, including personnel,
- 10 systems, and administrative expenses, pursuant to this part;
- 11 provided that funds shall be used only for purposes authorized
- 12 under federal guidelines.
- The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 14 human services for the purposes of this part.
- 15 PART VIII
- 16 SECTION 13. The department of human services, with the
- 17 assistance of the financial assistance advisory council, shall
- 18 implement a strategic planning process involving the community
- 19 to plan for future use of temporary assistance for needy
- 20 families funds and to set annual goals and outcomes for existing
- 21 and new programs receiving temporary assistance for needy
- 22 families funds, pursuant to section 346-14.5. The department

- 1 shall submit an annual report to the legislature, no later than
- 2 twenty days prior to the convening of each regular legislative
- 3 session, concerning the implementation of this part.
- 4 PART IX
- 5 SECTION 14. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2006.
