A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO VACANCIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 17-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended to read as follows: 3 "§17-1 United States senator. When a vacancy occurs in the office of United States senator the vacancy shall be filled 4
- for the unexpired term at the following state general election[___ 5
- provided that] if the vacancy occurs not later than 4:30 p.m. on 6
- 7 the sixtieth day prior to the primary for nominating candidates
- to be voted for at the election[; otherwise]. Otherwise the 8
- 9 vacancy shall be filled at the state general election next
- following. The chief election officer shall issue a 10
- 11 proclamation designating the election for filling the vacancy.
- Upon a vacancy occurring, the governor shall immediately notify **12**
- in writing the chair of the political party that the last 13
- incumbent represented at the time of election or appointment, if 14
- 15 not elected to office. Pending the election [the governor], the
- chair of the political party that the incumbent represented 16
- shall call a meeting of the state central committee of the 17

vacancy occurs. At the meeting, the state central committee 1 shall select and the chair shall submit to the governor the 2 names of not less than three persons qualified to fill the 3 vacancy. Within five days after receiving the list of names of 4 the nominees from the chair of the appropriate political party, 5 the governor shall make a temporary appointment of one of the 6 nominees to fill the vacancy [and the]. The person so appointed 7 shall serve until the election and qualification of the person 8 duly elected to fill the vacancy [and shall be a registered 9 member of the same political party as the senator causing the 10 11 vacancy]. All candidates for the unexpired term shall be 12 nominated and elected in accordance with this title." SECTION 2. Section 17-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 13 14 amended to read as follows: 15 "§17-3 State senator. (a) Whenever any vacancy in the membership of the state senate occurs, the term of which ends at 16 the next succeeding general election, the governor shall make an 17 appointment within sixty calendar days following the first day 18 of vacancy to fill the vacancy for the unexpired term and the 19 20 appointee shall be of the same political party or nonpartisanship as the person the appointee succeeds. 1	writing the chair of the political party that the last incumbent
2	represented at the time of election or appointment, if not
3	elected to office.
4	Pending an election, the chair of the party that the
5	incumbent represented shall call a meeting of the state central
6	committee of the party, to be held not later than twenty days
7	after the vacancy. At the meeting, the state central committee
8	shall select and the chair shall submit to the governor the
9	names of not less than three persons qualified to fill the
10	vacancy. Within five days after receiving the list of names of
11	the nominees from the chair of the appropriate party, the
12	governor shall make a temporary appointee from among the
13	nominees to fill the vacancy.
14	(b) In the case of a vacancy, the term of which does not
15	end at the next succeeding general election:
16	(1) If it occurs not later than on the tenth day prior to
17	the close of filing for the next succeeding primary
18	election, the vacancy shall be filled for the
19	unexpired term at the next succeeding general
20	election. The chief election officer shall issue a
21	proclamation designating the election for filling the
22	vacancy. All candidates for the unexpired term shall

be nominated and elected in accordance with this
title. Pending the election the governor shall make a
temporary appointment to fill the vacancy and the
person so appointed shall serve until the election of
the person duly elected to fill the vacancy. The
appointee shall be of the same political party or
nonpartisanship as the person the appointee
succeeds[+] and the temporary appointment shall be as
provided in this section.

If it occurs later than on the tenth day prior to the 10 (2) 11 close of filing for the next succeeding primary election but not later than on the sixtieth day prior 12 13 to the next succeeding primary election, or if there are no qualified candidates for any party or 14 15 nonpartisan candidates qualified for the primary election ballot, nominations for the unexpired term 16 may be filed not later than 4:30 p.m. on the fiftieth 17 day prior to the next succeeding primary election. 18 19 The chief election officer shall issue a proclamation designating the election for filling the vacancy. 20 Pending the election the governor shall make a 21 22 temporary appointment to fill the vacancy and the

person so appointed shall serve until the election of the person duly elected to fill the vacancy. The appointee shall be of the same political party or nonpartisanship as the person the appointee succeeds [-] and the temporary appointment shall be as provided in this section.

If it occurs after the sixtieth day prior to the next (3) succeeding primary but not later than on the fiftieth day prior to the next succeeding general election, or if there are no qualified candidates for any party or nonpartisan candidates in the primary, the vacancy shall be filled for the unexpired term at the next succeeding general election. The chief election officer shall issue a proclamation designating the election for filling the vacancy. Party candidates for the unexpired senate term shall be nominated by the county committees of the parties not later than 4:30 p.m. on the fortieth day prior to the general election; nonpartisan candidates may file nomination papers for the unexpired term not later than 4:30 p.m. on the fortieth day prior to the general election with the nonpartisan candidate who is to be nominated to be

1		decided by lot, under the supervision of the chief
2		election officer. The candidates for the unexpired
3		term shall be elected in accordance with this title.
4		Pending the election the governor shall make a
5		temporary appointment to fill the vacancy and the
6		person so appointed shall serve until the election of

20	SECT	ION 3. Section 17-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
21	amended to	o read as follows:

(a) Whenever any vacancy in the membership of the state house of representatives occurs, 2 3 the governor shall make an appointment within sixty calendar days following the first day of vacancy to fill the vacancy for 4 the unexpired term and the appointee shall be of the same 5 political party or nonpartisanship as the person the appointee 6 succeeds. Upon a vacancy occurring, the governor shall 7 8 immediately notify in writing the chair of the political party that the last incumbent represented at the time of election or 9 appointment, if not elected to office. 10 11 (b) If the person the appointee succeeds was a member of a political party, the chair of the party that the incumbent 12 13 represented shall call a meeting of the state central committee 14 of the party, to be held not later than twenty days after the 15 vacancy. At the meeting, the state central committee shall select and the chair shall submit to the governor the names of 16 17 not less than three persons qualified to fill the vacancy. Within five days after receiving the list of names of the 18 19 nominees from the chair of the appropriate party, the governor 20 shall make a temporary appointment from among the nominees to fill the vacancy." 21

Requires chair of appropriate political party to convene meeting of the central committee to select nominees and submit list to governor; requires governor to fill vacancy from list submitted by chair of the appropriate political party.
