A BILL FOR AN ACT

MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY FOR THE GATE MONEY PROGRAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. The legislature finds that approximately three 1 hundred inmates of the seven hundred or more inmates released 2 each year on parole do not have adequate funds for food, 3 clothing, and bus passes. It has been the practice of the 4 Hawaii Paroling Authority to provide up to \$200 to inmates in 5 need of emergency funds, commonly known as "gate money," for 6 this purpose. In recent years, the amount of gate money has 7 steadily declined due to other administrative demands. 8 According to the Hawaii Paroling Authority, the parole 9 population has risen from 1,804 on July 1, 1997, to 2,622 as of 10 July 1, 2003, a thirty-one per cent increase. With a steadily 11 increasing parole population coupled with inherent challenges 12 faced by the paroled prisoner attempting to successfully 13 reintegrate back into the community, gate money becomes a 14

- 1 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$60,000, or so much
- 3 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2006-2007, for the
- 4 "gate money" program.
- 5 SECTION 3. The sum appropriated shall be expended by the
- 6 department of public safety for the purposes of this Act.
- 7 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2006.
